

METHODS TO UNDERSTAND YOUR STUDENTS

When you listen to student's stories, you get insights into their strengths, preferences, interests etc. Sharing and listening also establishes trust and rapport.

The student's council is a method of creating a space for students to voice their emotions, thoughts, ideas or make decisions freely without feeling judged. Observing this space can enable teachers to understand individuals and group dynamics. This method encourages personal storytelling and is very helpful to nurture personal and community development. The morning meeting is a great way to understand your learners. It can be an engaging way to start the day as it builds a sense of community and focuses attention on the present. It may entail a greeting, a small energising activity and and sharing by students.

Interest-A-Lyzer

A form developed by educators which can be used to gauge learner's interests. Designed for senior learners.

The Four Pillars of Learning

Pillar 1: Attention





One can't learn without paying attention. Attention acts like a filter that allows us to select a piece of information and then decide what to do with it.

Students can learn most effectively when they know when to attend, what to attend to, and how to process the attended

Pillar 2: Active engagement



Learning requires the brain to be active and curious. Nothing implants new knowledge in one's brain and memory better than intellectual struggle.

People are engaged when they are generating ideas, participating actively, and testing their

Pillar 3: Feedback



Brain learns by making predictions, validating accurate predictions and forgetting incorrect ones. In this process, errors are inevitable but absolutely essential. Therefore instead of trying to avoid mistakes, make and correct mistakes. Getting feedback after

Pillar 4: Consolidation




Memorizing new information or acquiring new skills is merely the first step. Knowledge must be consolidated for it to become an automatic response or expertise. For this the brain needs sleep and repetition. Every night, brain consolidates information by transferring important events

On the Insert tab. the galleries include items that are designed to coordinate with the overall look of your document. You can use the egalleries to insert tables, headers, footers, lists, cover pages, and other document building blocks. When you create pictures, charts, or diagrams, they also coordinate with your current document look.

You can easily change the formatting of selected text in the document text by choosing a look for the selected text from the Quick Styles gallery on the Home tab. You can also format text directly by using the other controls on the Home tab. Most controls offer a choice of using the look from the current theme or using a format that you specify directly.

To change the overall look of your document, choose new Theme elements on the Page Layout tab. To change the looks available in the Quick Style gallery, use the Change Current Quick Style Set command. Both the Themes gallery and the Quick Styles gallery provide reset commands so that you can always restore the look of your document to the original contained in your current template.




