3. Optional: To see popular maps and staff picks, click explore.

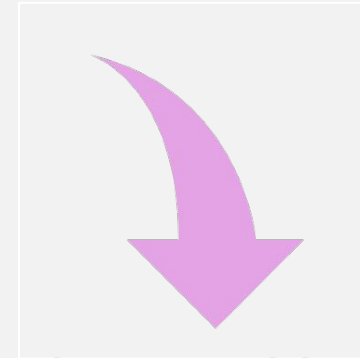
Change how a map looks

4. To choose a style, click one of the images.

View maps you can't edit

If you can open a map but can't edit what's on it, you're in the map viewer. In the map viewer, you can still:

- Search the map contents
 - Show or hide layers
 - View the map with satellite imagery
 - Share, export, and print the map
- If you own a map and want to see it in the map viewer, click Preview.
- To ask for edit access for a map you can't edit, contact the map's owner.

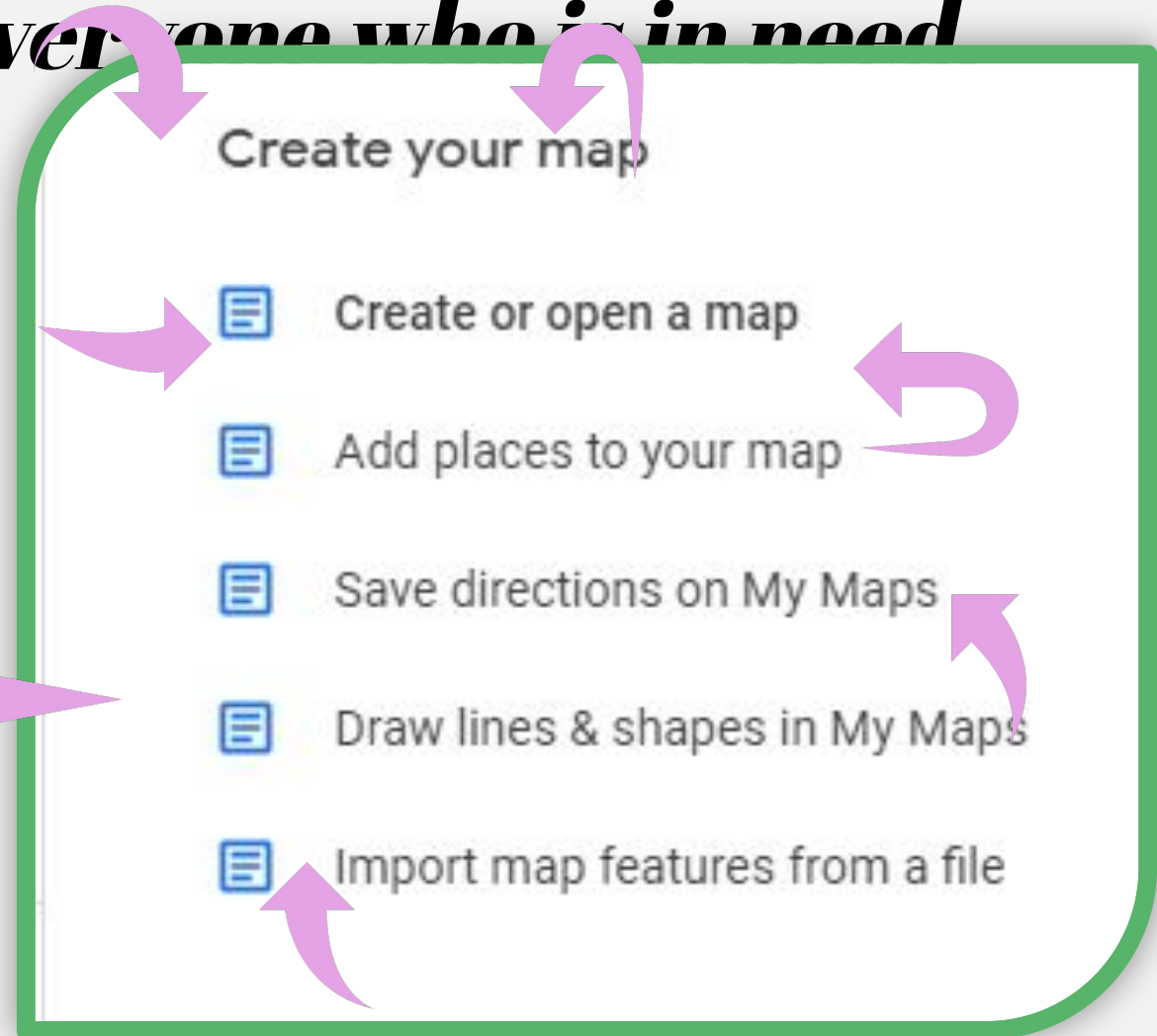
