


- Android app has been developed by the IT Cell at Directorate and is available on the Google Play store.


Geo-Tagging Attendance

- An initiative of online attendance in schools by teachers.
- Location of teacher in school ,physical presence and the school reporting time is tracked.
- The report is automatically generated in DSEK.
- The facility of Feedback SMS from DSEK to schools is also included.
- The intervention has been piloted in GHSS Rajbagh, GHSS Sonwar, GHSS Zadibal and BHSS Zadibal to begin with. All the schools of the Kashmir Division will be brought under this intervention in a phased manner

Online Academic Monitoring & School Tracking system using Google Docs through a network of DRGs, ZRPs and CRPs-Learning Level Assessments (Elementary)

- As mentioned in Academic Planner, School Performance Index (SPI) which reflects Children Engagement ,School Activities and Learning Levels as per Learning Outcomes ,an online Academic Assessment & School Processes Tracker (Assessment Tool) has been formulated.
- Team DRGs ,ZRPs & CRPs visit elementary schools and apply this Assessment Tool in these Schools.
- The School Processes are punched online on Mobile Phone in App/Google Doc in assessment tool.
- We get Real-time capture of School Performance Index a snapshot of District-wise, Zone-wise and School wise performance of Children & School.

- Concerned ZEO shares the School Performance Reports with Headmasters in the Monthly Meeting and reflects accordingly.
- ZRPs/CRPs/DRGs render on site Academic support to the schools based on the outcomes of the school.
- CEO/DIET Principal holds Monthly review ZEOs on the School Performance of his/her Zone.
- DSEK team/SCERT review CEOs/Principal DIETs on the school performance of their districts.
- School Grading is done and the performing schools to are felicitated and under performers are given special focussed upon.




Central move office SCERT JK along with IT Experts sensitized the teachers of Bihar and Ladakh regarding the e content creation using different open sources software's.

- · If you notice that your fake account has been created, you can immediately inform social media service provider so that the account can be blocked
- · Use passphrase instead of passwords, change password regularly.

- · If your social media account is hacked/ compromised, send an alert e-mail or message to all vour contacts. Immediately ask your social media service provider to temporarily block your account. Try to retrieve your password and change your password immediately.

- · Always remember to sign off from your account
