From the Joint Director's Desk

Similar to that of the previous quarters, CIET, NCERT carried out the regular activities under its various programmes.

As per the Budget Announcements of February 2022 the GoI has planned to start 200 more DTH TV channels for states/UTs in various Indian languages in order to enhance inclusivity, reach and access to quality educational eContent for the learners all across the length and breadth of India. For this, the 'Training Programme for Channel Coordinators and Subject Matter Experts of States/UTs for PM eVIDYA DTH TV Channels', Phase-1 was organised for five States/UTs (Chandigarh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Punjab) in collaboration with SCERT Chandigarh at Chandigarh from 17-19 August 2022. About forty five subject matter experts, technical experts and channel coordinators participated in the training programme.

In order to develop quality eContent for teaching-learning process through Television, which is generally a one-way medium of interaction with the learners, the guidelines for development of engaging eContent for the same is required. For this purpose, a 'Guidelines for Development of Engaging eContents for Educational Television' was drafted as per the directions of PMO, Gol. In order to finalise the guidelines, a half-day meeting for the 'Finalization of Guidelines for Development of Engaging eContents for Educational Television' was organised on 27 September, 2022 at CIET, NCERT where opinion from experts from related fields was sought.

For a healthy and academic discourse to take place in the field of ET and ICT, CIET also publishes an online open access journal in English. The July 2022 issue of Indian Journal of Educational Technology (IJET) was published on its website.

Apart from these activities, coordination meetings of DIKSHA with States/UTs, recording of ISL programmes and training programmes for other activities were also carried out.

We will keep our stakeholder updated on the activities and interventions carried out by the institution on a regular basis. Under Effectiveness of Augmented reality based e-contents and Virtual labs on achievement in Science of class IX school students, review of available literature was done and questionnaire was being developed. Achievement test in science based on AR app and virtual lab e-content has been drafted. Reaction towards Virtual Labs (VL) and Augmented Reality (AR) Content Scale for students and teachers was drafted. Two-day workshop on 22-23 September 2022 was conducted at CIET for finalizing the achievement tests.

In An evaluative study of ICT @ School Scheme under Samagra Shiksha, collection of related literature was carried out. Based on tools used at 2017-18 CIET third party evaluation study, Survey tools for Teachers, Students and School Administrators have been drafted as part of data gathering tools development. A three-day workshop was conducted from 6-9 September 2022 for development and finalisation of tools for data collection. A total of five questionnaires, one each for principal, IT instructor, Teacher, Special Educator and Students have been finalized in the same.

Based on review of related literature, a final draft of tools (questionnaires and FGD) were developed in **Effectiveness of ICT based accessible interventions (UDL-based e-Contents) of NCERT on holistic development of students with special needs.** These tools are for studying the awareness, need-based assessment, practices & usage, and feedback about the 'UDL based eContent such as ISL videos and audiobooks developed by CIET, NCERT' for students, teachers and special educators. The tool finalisation workshop was organised from 30-31 August 2022. In addition, a Focus Group Discussion was planned for students. Four schools of Delhi-NCR were identified for pilot testing of finalised tools. Planning for visiting these schools for pilot testing is in progress. In-house packaging of UDL based eContents is in progress in online as well as offline mode.

In Effectiveness of ICT in Education Courses on ICT competency and Techno-Pedagogy Integration Competency of in-service Teachers at Secondary Level, review of related literature and development of research tools is in progress. A sample ICT module was being drafted as a general guideline in reference to the workshop to be conducted.

Review of related literature and development of research tools was carried out in A study on the effectiveness of Cyber Safety & Security Awareness Package implemented through the cascade and direct intervention models.

Under A study of different modes of online education adopted by Elementary school teachers during the pandemic, the collection of related literature and the modification of data gathering tools is in progress. Letters have been sent to five RIEs to nominate a faculty member for being part of the study and preparation is being done for the further action.

In e-Learning initiatives in India for students at secondary stage during Covid-19 pandemic: experience based need assessment including gender perspective, questionnaire for Teachers and for Focussed Group Discussion for parents of students have been prepared, translated in Hindi and finalised. Data collection was completed in two states: Gujarat and Sikkim.

A five-day interventional Training programme on "Integration of ICT in Education as a part of Implementing ICT integration at school stage: A block-level research study" was oraganised in RIE Ajmer for the training of 40 Hurda teachers from 22-26 August 2022 under Implementing ICT interventions at school stage: a block level research study. Data collection was done in this workshop through Pre and Post-test during the intervention training programme. Data analysis of this block indicated that the knowledge and skill-based competency was enhanced after the training and there was a change in the attitude of teachers after the training programme. Planning of interventional training programme in second block i.e. Icchawar, Madhya Pradesh of the study is being done.

Under **Development and dissemination of e-content at Foundational Literacy and Numeracy level,** a workshop was conducted from 5-7 September 2022 at CIET, NCERT for developing audio scripts in three languages: English, Hindi and Urdu. About 19 resource persons participated in the workshop and about thirty eight scripts were developed.

In Development of Curriculum Based materials of Augmented Reality (AR) and Virtual Reality (VR) Simulation and 3D videos in science for School Education, a two-week workshop was conducted from 11-23 July 2022 for the development of AR simulations. About 8 AR simulations were developed and reviewed. About 10 Scripts for development of AR storyboards were also written. Nine AR 3D rendered videos were developed and mapped as per the chapters on DIKSHA portal/mobile app. Four AR simulations were updated in the new ePathshala AR App on NCERT Server. Bug reported and fixed in the beta version of the app.

Development and dissemination of educational audio, video programs in order to support the teaching-learning among students, teachers, educators and other stakeholders is done under **Development and Dissemination of Educational Media Programmes.** Under video production, a total of 253 video programs were produced in this quarter. Regarding audio Production, a total of 2,320 audio programmes were developed in this quarter. The details are given in table-1.

Various activities were undertaken in the **Development and Rollout of Curricula for ICT in Education for School systems.** As part of school collaboration, the fifth live interaction was completed with Israel and DMS Certificates for 262 participants was verified and issued. With Korea, coordinators' meeting was held on 21 July 2022 with 9 schools and planning of students' interaction is in progress.

Webinars on use and integration of technology 36 sessions were conducted in this quarter Online Training- Online training on "Digital Pedagogy" is conducted from 25-29 July, 2022 Cyber Safety and Security- Cyber Jagrookta Divas sessions were conducted on the theme 'Stay Safe in Cyber World', 'Safe Digital Gaming' and 'Being Safe and Responsible Digital Citizen' each having 1 Cyber Jaagrookta Diwas and 3 technical sessions. Under 'Staying Safe in cyber world' Quiz 7,969 people attempted and 3,689 were certified. For 'Being Safe and Responsible Digital Citizen' Quiz, 5,606 students attempted and 4,744 have been certified for the same. Course outline finalized for the course on cyber safety and security. A Conference was organised on Positive Digital Footprints on the occasion of Shikshak Parv 2022.

ICT Curriculum Course- Review of the online courses- Draft 1 (Induction 01 and Refresher 01) was done.

Online Training- Online Training on "Multimedia Resources for Teaching, Learning and Assessment" was conducted from 22-26 August, 2022 and on "Virtual Labs for Teaching, Learning and Assessment" from 26-30 September, 2022.

Under **Standardization of Indian Sign Language**, vetting of the Finalization of word list for collecting the sign variants from states/UT's and SoP's for data collection by CIET internal team which was prepared during the workshop held in June 2022. Certificates were sent to 2,701 eligible participants who scored 70 percent or more in the final quiz which was based on a six-day online training on Specific Learning Disabilities held from 20-25 June 2022. The 7th Core Committee meeting of ISL standardisation was held on 10 August 2022 to discuss the SOP for further collection of regional variations in the signs and to finalise region-wise allocation of experts. The 8th Core Committee meeting of ISL standardisation was held on 6 September 2022 to confirm the regional team list and finalisation of SOPs for collecting regional signs by the team members. A meeting of members of ISL standardisation core committee, expected to coordinate with organisations located in the states in zone 1 and zone 2 was conducted on 22 September, 2022. The statewise list of organisations to be contacted, for gathering regional variations of signs against the predefined word list and finger spellings and observations for new signs developed for academic terms was finalised for zone 1 and 2.

ISL-based video production: Total no. of videos produced were 1,009 (including Class 6, Glossary words of Economics, History, Geography, Sociology and Psychology and for Bhasha Sangam). About 10,000 words ISL Dictionary developed by ISLRTC is being disseminated. Total number of videos uploaded on Diksha portal was 914.

- ePathshala mobile app was uploaded on JioBook and MobileSeva.
- A total of 914 ISL videos were uploaded on DIKSHA.
- Prashast app Statistical report plugin was completed and multilingual string conversion is in progress.
- ePathshala Cloud messaging was carried out on a daily basis.
- Uploading of available journals of NCERT was carried out for the development and launch of OJS (Open Journal System).
- ICT awards portal was made live for entries from all over India.
- Laboratory manuals from Class 9-12 were uploaded on DIKSHA (Vidyadaan)
- Security audits of 4 websites were carried out.




Figure-2: Mobile apps of NCERT with app downloads till September 2022

In the DIKSHA/ICT Excellence Award for School Teachers, Teacher Educators and States/UTs, out of 36 States/UTs, about 23 State/UT and 6 autonomous organisations completed the evaluation process and forwarded for national level evaluation. Evaluation in the rest of the States/UTs was carried out.

Under the Organization of Festival, ICT Mela, contests of digital contents and coordination with States/UTs, different categories have been included for providing opportunity to all aspirants who are keen to participate in the festival. Redrafting of 27th AICEAVF form, announcement & advertisement was carried out.

Management of PM eVIDYA (One Class, One Channel, Radio, Broadcast, Podcasts)

Dissemination of audio & video programmes for classes 1-12 was done through DTH TV Channels, podcast and radio. Monthly transmission schedules of all the 12 PM eVIDYA DTH TV channels for the quarter was shared with BISAG as a regular activity.

These 12 eVIDYA TV channels are run in 24x7 mode. Currently, the total duration of the fresh programmes daily on the telecast is 2 to 3 hours (2 hours for classes 1-9 and 3 hours for classes 10-12). The programmes were produced in both Hindi and English mediums. A half an hour extra slot for ISL has been created for classes 1-5 in the existing two hours duration. The Classwise and subject wise details of the videos are given in Table-6.

Community Radio and Podcast

PM eVIDYA venture also offers educational e-contents (especially audio programmes) on radio platforms; both traditional radio e. g. FM as well as online radio e. g. podcast. Till end of this quarter, 3,614 pieces of curriculum-based radio programmes (Classes 1-12) have been disseminated for broadcast. And till now 1731 Live Programs have been broadcast through iRadio and JioSaavn apps.





Viewership details

PM eVIDYA Channels can also be accessed using JIO TV Mobile app and the viewership from September 2020 to August 2022 was 96,11,920.

The training of States/UTs is required for the launch and successful running of 200+ DTH TV Channels which has been planned in a phased manner. The 'Training Programme for Channel Coordinators and Subject Matter Experts of States/UTs for PM eVIDYA DTH TV Channels', Phase-1 was organised for 5 States/UTs (Chandigarh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Punjab) at Chandigarh from 17-19 August 2022. About 45 subject matter experts, technical experts and channel coordinators participated in the training programme.

A half-day meeting for the 'Finalization of Guidelines for Development of Engaging eContents for Educational Television' was organised on 27 September, 2022 at CIET, NCERT. The meeting was attended by various experts from the field of Mass Communication and Education and provided their inputs for the guidelines. The second draft guideline was prepared and submitted for approval.

The 22nd, 23rd and 24th DIKSHA States/UTs coordination meeting (online) was carried out on 27 July, 29 August and 28 September 2022, respectively under **DIKSHA - One Nation One Digital Platform.** An online meeting was held on 23 September 2022 with Manipur regarding creation of cultural repositories on the state's tenant under ESBS. A zoom meeting for the "Demonstration of Virtual labs on DIKSHA and ePathshala AR" content was also held on 12 September 2022 for the Teachers from DM Schools in RIE's, NCERT. Regarding courses, the review process of a CPD course, Catch the Rain (Hindi version) was carried out.

NISHTHA

Course 01 and 02 of NISHTHA 4.0 (ECCE) in Hindi and English were finalised and uploaded on DIKSHA. NISHTHA 2.0 and NISHTHA 3.0 courses were re-run in 33 States/UTs and collection of reports from States/UTs is in progress. Development of Course 03 and 04 of NISHTHA 4.0 (ECCE) was being finalized. Troubleshooting related to data was carried out.

Thirteen (13) new OLabs were developed after the launch of Virtual Labs on DIKSHA under the **Development of Virtual Lab**.

Under the **Development and roll-out of courses for MOOCs on SWAYAM (School MOOCs for Classes 9th-12th and MOOCs for Teacher Education)** enrollment for Cycle 9 was completed with 22,645 enrollments for 28 online courses. Proposals for 33 courses have been received.

Under the **Online courses on DIKSHA** various activities were carried out for launch and running of courses.

CPD Courses- Catch the rain in collaboration with UNICEF was reviewed by an internal team at the development work level and shared with the course committee to incorporate modifications.

Value Education- Draft of the course was reviewed by an internal team and shared with the course committee to prepare the course as per the framework.

Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat- Reviewed by an internal team at the development work level and shared with the course committee to incorporate modifications.

ATL game-based learning in collaboration with AIM, NITI Aayog- Draft resources from the course committee were received and were reviewed by an internal team.

Samagra Shiksha- Draft resources from the course committee were received and were reviewed by an internal team.

Participation in Conferences/Seminars and publication:

Prof. Amarendra P. Behera attended the National Workshop on Post National Achievement Survey (NAS) organized on 28 July 2022. During the event, Hon'ble MoS for Education, Smt. Annapurna Devi launched the 'NAS 2021 Mobile Application' during the National Programme. Smt. Anita Karwal, Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy and other dignitaries from NCERT, CBSE HQ, KVS HQ and Samagra Shiksha & SCERT were also present on this occasion.
