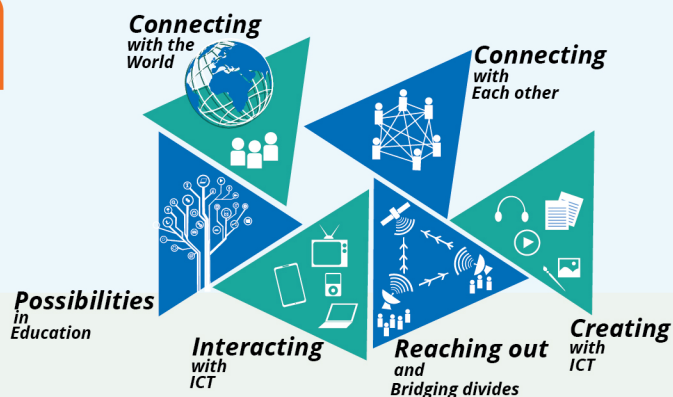

From the Joint Director's Desk

CIET as an institution working for technological interventions at the school level worked for its various programmes with full vigour.

Following the recommendations of NEP 2020, CIET organized a five-day online training on 'Virtual Labs for Teaching and Learning' from 27-31 December 2021 in collaboration with CDAC, Mumbai. This training was aimed at enabling teachers, students and various stakeholders to perform experiments or practical lessons on different subjects on a platform for easy access. The sessions were telecast live on PM eVIDYA TV channels and were also simulcast on the NCERT OFFICIAL YouTube channel. The sessions were viewed by around 85,000 viewers. A quiz based on the sessions has also been conducted on the DIKSHA platform.

A review meeting of DIKSHA was conducted on 3 December 2021. The meeting was graced by Sh. Santosh Sarangi, Additional Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, MoE, GoI, Sh. Rajnish Kumar, Director, Digital Education, Department of School Education and Literacy, MoE, GoI. DIKSHA team from CIET-NCERT participated in the meeting. The current status of DIKSHA (One Nation, One Platform) as a resilient and coherent system for digital education was discussed in light of the implementation of the vision of NEP-2020 and N-DEAR goals. State coordination meetings were also conducted for DIKSHA.

Various activities were undertaken for all the programmes of CIET. We will keep the stakeholders informed about the works of our institution.

A research study aiming at **Implementing ICT Interventions at School Stage: A Block level Research Study is being undertaken by CIET**. A review of the ICT Curriculum modules for training of teachers in ICT was done and the themes and modules were identified based on the competency scale developed during the first phase. Along with this three days' workshop from 20-22 December 2021 was organized with various experts focusing on a) Discussion on the findings of the first phase of research b) Discussion on the Intervention Plan (modifying ICT curriculum modules and updating with new ones) and c) Discussion on the Impact study strategy and logistics of intervention. According to the feedback received by experts modules and the research tools finalization is under process.

Under the **Development of the Model for ICT Integrated School System** for the capacity building of NCERT faculty including DMS on the use and integration of ICT/ET, a coordination meeting was conducted with the Principals of all RIEs and HMs of all DMS on 2 November 2021. The first planning meeting was conducted for the 'School online programme' with all the four DM School coordinators and the respective Israel school Coordinators. First orientation for coordinators was conducted for 'School online programme' on 2 Dec 2021, to brief various activities to be carried out as part of the project. The first online collaborative activity was initiated in all four schools. A five days' online training on 'Virtual Labs for Teaching and Learning' for interested faculty and students was conducted from 27-31 December 2021.

In **Development of Position Paper on Educational Technology** a draft Working Paper, brief of Working Paper and e template has been developed and shared with DCS, NCERT. Questions for mobile app, Mygov survey and district level consultations were also developed and shared.

Fifteen Augmented Reality (AR) 3D simulated videos of Classes 9&10 for Science were developed with the help of a month-long workshop held from 20 September-20 October 2021 and were uploaded on DIKSHA under **Development of Curriculum-Based material of AR, VR, Simulation, Virtual Laboratory for School Education**.

Under **Development and Dissemination of Educational Media Programs** audio, video and new media programmes are produced.

Audio Production: 541 audio programs were produced.

The Development and rollout of Online and Blended Courses for Teachers, Teacher Education and Students had various activities under the three sub-heads: development, implementation and training.

Development: 1. Development of two courses on Cyber hygiene is in the process in collaboration with ISEA, CDAC, Hyderabad 2. Development of course on 'Developing digital game-based eContent' is in progress in collaboration with ATAL 3. Customisation of the course on 'Catch the Rain' in collaboration with UNICEF is in process 4. Customisation of Urdu Language Script Writing (Hindi version) is in process in collaboration with DEL. Development of 10 CPD courses on DIKSHA and rollout of the courses. Development of the following courses is in the process: (a) Development of Game-Based Digital Resources in collaboration with ATAL Tinkering Mission (b) Cyber Hygiene in collaboration with ISEA-CDAC, Hyderabad (c) Catch the Rain in collaboration with UNICEF (d) Value Education for School by DEPFE (e) Pedagogy of Social sciences by DESS.

Implementation: Batch 2 of the following four courses start on 16 September 2021 till 31 December 2021
1. COVID-19 Responsive Behaviour (Hindi), 2. COVID-19 Responsive Behaviour (English), 3. Action Research- October-November 2021, 4. Urdu Language Script Writing- October-November 2021. Batch 1 of Catch the Rain course and Batch 2 of Cyber Hygiene were started in December 2021.

Online Training/Webinar: Continuous orientation of various stakeholders on use and integration of ICT/ET through webinar/training/workshop etc.: 1. 61 Webinar sessions conducted on ET and ICT (a) ICT/ET tools and techniques-10 (b) Sharing of ICT Awardee's journey-12 (c) Sharing of National and State Initiatives-12 (d) Cyber Safety and Security-10, 2. Five days' online training on 'Stay Safe on Cyber World' conducted during 25-29 October 2021 3. Cyber Jagrookta Diwas Orientation Session conducted on 6 October 2021 and 1,576 were certified, 4. Online quiz on Social Engineering Attacks and Security Quiz has been initiated on 6 October 2021 and around 4,104 were certified, 5. Cyber Jagrookta Divas webinar on 'Cyber Clubs' was conducted on 3 November 2021, 6. Four days' online workshop on "Innovative Pedagogies for Online Education" was conducted during 23-27 November 2021, 7. Online quiz on Social Engineering Attacks and Security Quiz has been initiated on 6 October 2021 and till date around has 20,097 participated and 5,039 were certified, 8. Evaluation of eRaksha competitions is in progress in collaboration with Cyber Peace Foundation, 9. Five days' online workshop on "Virtual Labs for Teaching and Learning" was conducted from 27-31 December 2021 in collaboration with CDAC, Mumbai.

Under **Resource-cum-Activity Centre in ET/ICT for School and Teacher Education** an online internship programme for M.Ed. and B.Ed.-M.Ed. integrated programme for 52 students from RIE, Bhopal was organised from 8-12 Nov 2021. An exposure visit of B.Ed., M.Ed. students and faculty from Galgotia University, Greater Noida was organized on 23 December 2021. A student of B.A (Hons.) Journalism at Institute of Home Economics, Hauz Khas, New Delhi completed the internship program at CIET, NCERT from 1 Nov-31 December 2021 under MPD. An internship programme for M.Ed. students from JMI, Delhi was also organised from 27 December 2021-7 January 2022. Through these, students acquired knowledge about the various ICT Initiatives taken at the national level and acquired the skills to use various ICT Tools which can be used in teaching-learning. CIET's library is a storehouse of books, periodicals and newspapers. It has a total of 14,566 books (General books-8,646 and Childrens' literature-5,920), a subscription of 26 magazines and 12 newspapers. A total of 35 books were purchased for CIET's library.

For **Online Publication of Indian Journal of Educational Technology and quarterly Newsletter of CIET** an online workshop for reviewing manuscripts submitted to IJET was organised from 18 November-22 November 2021. The January 2022 issue of the journal is being compiled. The July-September 2021 issue of CIET's newsletter has been uploaded on CIET's website (<https://ciet.nic.in/NewsletterJuly-sep2021/>)

Under **Development and Maintenance of Websites, Mobile Apps and Other Digital Activities** a portal has been developed for the application process for the Diploma Course in Guidance and Counselling. A web portal for making the Tamanna Aptitude test in online mode is being developed. The Doctoral Fellowship portal and Research Associateship Portal are also being developed. AICEAVF page was also modified in this quarter as per the Guidelines. International Webinar on Toys and Games to play, make and learn page has been designed. The vulnerability issue was resolved on ePathshala server (Cross-Site Scripting vulnerability (XSS) and API). CIET's Website was upgraded with php version on the staging server. Tamanna web portal modification and API development for the mobile app were also carried out. A workshop page was created on CIET's website and footer design modifications were made on NCERT's website. Kala Utsav website was updated. UAT sign-off for NCF website and portal and codebase for ePathshala scanner app was developed. Development of web applications of Jawaharlal Nehru National Science, Mathematics and Environment Exhibitions for Children was done. Apart from this, regular uploading of documents, vacancy notifications, tenders, etc. and uploading of audio and video sets in MP3 and MP4 formats on the NCERT OFFICIAL YouTube channel was carried out.

Figure-1: Analytics of ePathshala till December 2021

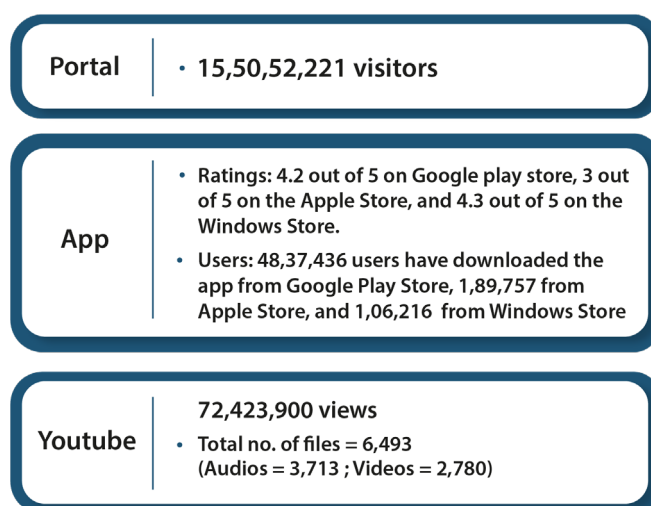
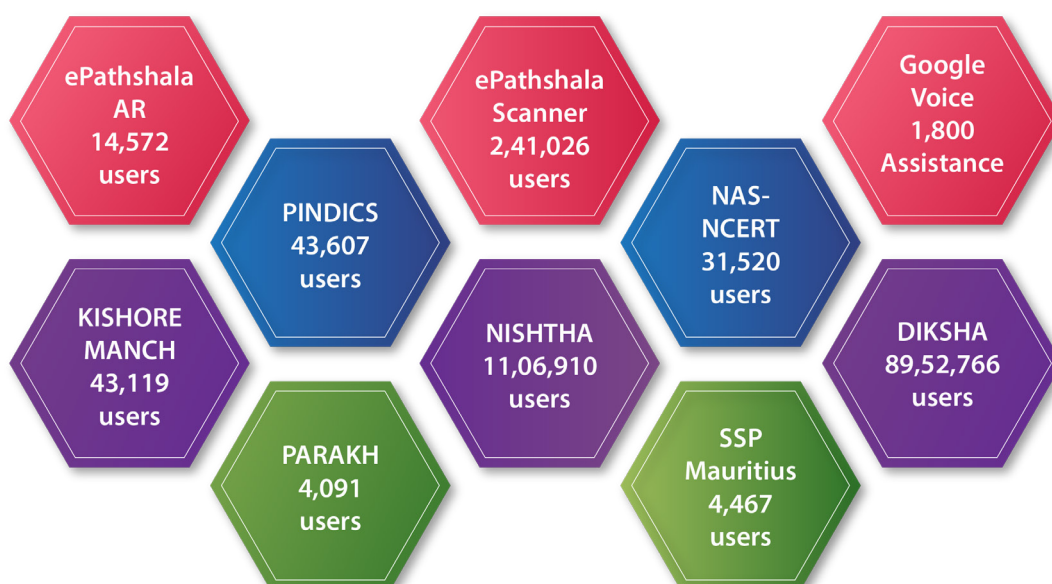


Figure-2: Mobile apps of NCERT with app downloads till December 2021



In **Standardization of Indian Sign Language** CIET has recorded 949 sign language videos in Indian Sign Language (ISL) in collaboration with ISLRTC. The breakup for these is: class 1 to 5 textbooks based videos-535, class 6-33, National Anthem-1, e-comic book-32, DTH ISL interpretation-33, Bhasha Sangam-25 (including two promos) and Economics glossary-290. Out of the total 949 videos, 510 videos related to textbooks for classes 1 to 5 are available on DIKSHA post their launch on 23 September 2021 i.e. the international day of Sign Language Day. A core committee has been identified for initiating the task of standardization of ISL. The fifth meeting of this core team was held on 7 October 2021 to detail the major task of ISL sign variants collection, development of dictionary and course in ISL. ISL advocacy is being done through live interactive sessions on PMeVIDYA DTH TV Channels, under "Teaching Learning Interventions in Inclusive Classrooms". Till December 2021, 224 sessions of thirty minutes each, worth 111 hours have been telecast on PMeVIDYA DTH TV Channels we telecast with an ISL interpreter. A ten thousand words dictionary in ISL has been prepared by ISLRTC and all 10,000 words videos have been uploaded on DIKSHA. An attempt was made to popularize the ISL by extracting 200 day-to-day words from the dictionary of 10,000 words, and augmenting these video words with audio and subtext so that anyone may engage with these 200 words, which are also available in the form of a flipbook on ePathshala. Work on the rest of the words is in progress. Sign to text translations of all 10,000 words videos are completed, 3,000 words from these are in

the process of audio recording and a second level sign to text vetting is completed for 6,000 more words in workshop mode with the help of hearing-impaired leaders.

Under **Development and roll-out of courses for MOOCs on SWAYAM (School MOOCs for Classes 9th – 12th and MOOCs for Teacher Education)**, 28 courses across 11 subjects of class 11 and 12 were launched on 20 Dec 2021 for cycle 8 and till December 2021 1,300 learners have joined the courses. Integration of NCERT Gsuite in SWAYAM portal is in progress. Formatting of course materials for starting cycle 8 and identifying new courses for cycle 9 is in progress.

Under **DIKSHA- One Nation One Digital Platform** various activities were undertaken. The Page hits on DIKSHA till December 2021 was 2,799+ crores with an average daily page hits 5+ crores. A total of 4,946 Textbooks are energized by States/UTs and published on DIKSHA, including 361 textbooks of NCERT. A total of 2,35,221 pieces of e-content are live on DIKSHA. 378 FLN content according to the new curricular and pedagogical framework has been uploaded on DIKSHA. 568 CBSE Shikshawani audios have been uploaded on DIKSHA. About 3,196 audiobook chapters have been developed and uploaded on DIKSHA. For Adult Education, all 166 pieces of content have been reviewed and uploading is in progress. Under Critical Life Skills, 10 assessment sheets of Foundational Literacy uploaded on DIKSHA and 4 infographics have been uploaded under “Promotional Material”.

Interaction with NICSI Empaneled Tier-I agencies was held for onboarding a PMU for DIKSHA. One agency will be selected soon and on board. An Industry orientation workshop was organized on 29 Oct 2021 to orient various Cloud Service Providers for DIKSHA hosting. Other activities include: Carrying out of DIKSHA States/UTs coordination monthly meeting, Demonstration of FLN resources in 5 regional workshops, Identification of a PMU for DIKSHA and formation of a committee by NICSI for floating an RFP for a Microsoft Azure CSP (Approach Notes have been received from 4 Cloud Service Providers (CSPs) post the technical consultation)

For **DIKSHA/ICT Excellence Award for School Teachers, Teacher Educators and States/UTs** results of the National ICT award for the years 2018 & 2019 have been declared. 25 teachers for the year 2018 and 24 teachers for the year 2019 have been selected for conferring awards. Preparation for the award ceremony is in progress. Advertisement/Press release for National ICT Award 2020 & 2021 has been initiated. Development of a 4-minute inaugural video for the event has been completed.

Organization of Festival, ICT Mela, contests of digital contents and coordination with States/ UTs is a unique event organized annually by NCERT. Festival invites were sent to all RIEs, PSSCIVE, SIETs, SCERTs, EMMRC, SPD, MoE, MoD, MoTA, CEC, NIE, KVS, NVS, CBSE, Vigyan Prasar, IIMC and heads of all the departments in CIET, NCERT. Festival advertisements were also published in various newspapers with QR Codes and on various social media platforms. A total of 245 registrations has been received till December 2021 for the 26th AICEAVF.

Management of PM e-VIDYA (One Class, One Channel, Radio Broadcast, Podcasts)

The video programmes were produced by CIET, NCERT involving its various constituent units including the National Institute of Education (NIE), Pandit Sunderlal Sharma Central Institute of Vocational Education (PSSCIVE) and Regional Institute(s) of Education (RIEs). Other government and non-governmental organisations contributing to content creation include the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), Rotary India Literacy Mission (RILM), CDAC, Seed to Sapling, Arvind Gupta etc. The details for which are given in table-2.

Till December 2021 the total number of programmes produced and procured for the PM eVIDYA Channels were 6,255 for which the details are given in table-4.

These 12 eVIDYA TV channels are run in 24x7 mode. The total duration of the fresh programmes daily on the telecast is 2 to 3 hours (2 hours for classes 1-10 and 3 hours for classes 11-12). The programmes are telecast in both Hindi and English mediums. From September 2021 onwards all the primary classes 1,3, 4 and 5, a half an hour extra slot for ISL has been created; for class 2 half an hour slot for ISL content have been included in the existing two hours duration. The class-wise and subject-wise details of the videos being telecast on 12 channels of PM eVIDYA are given in table-5.

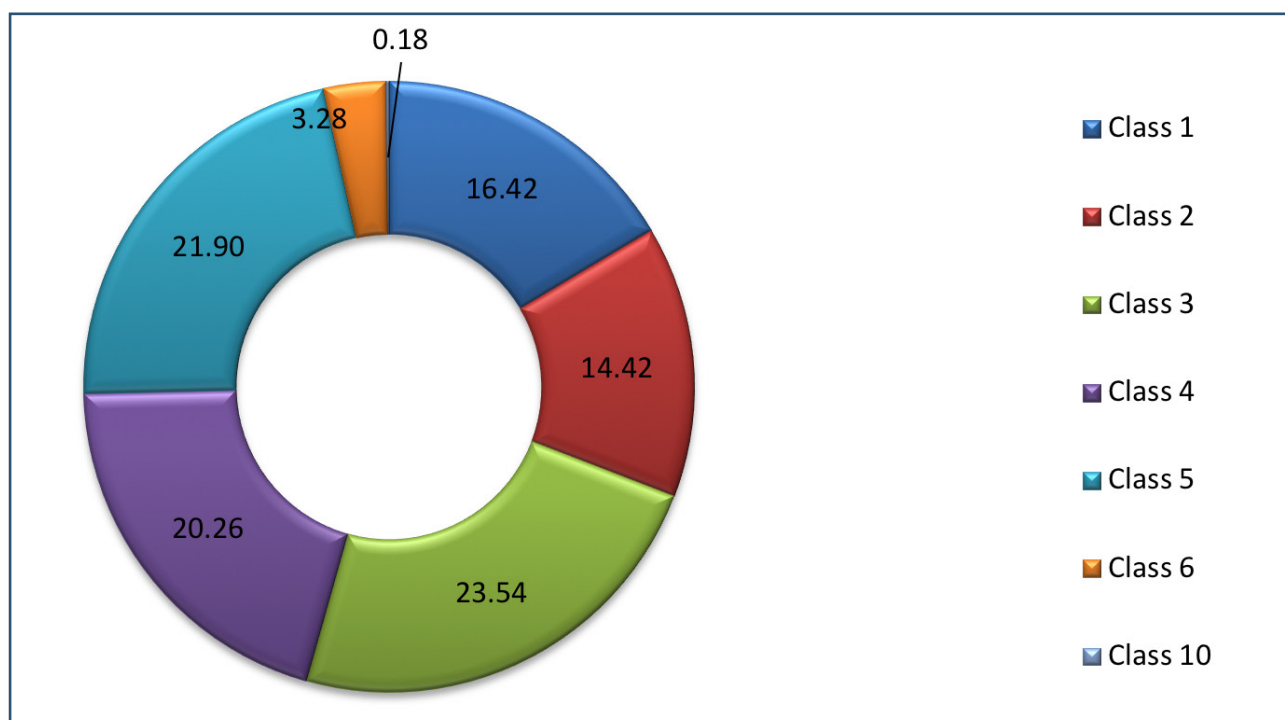
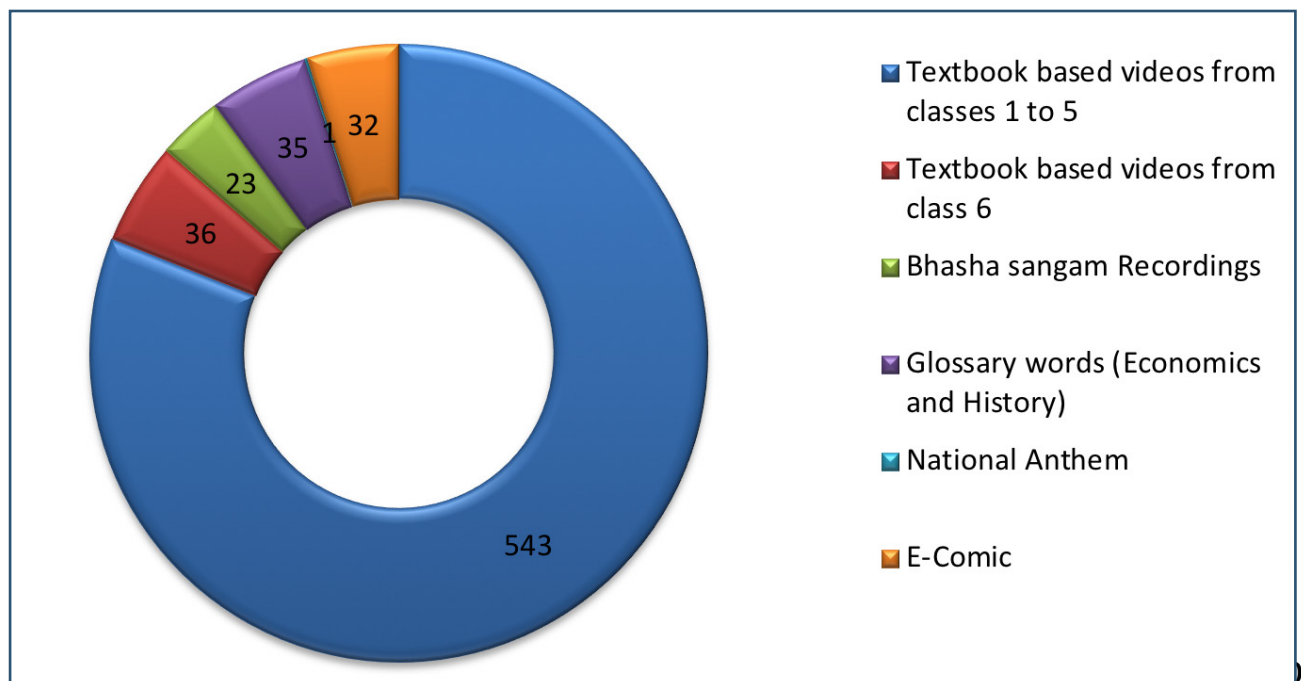

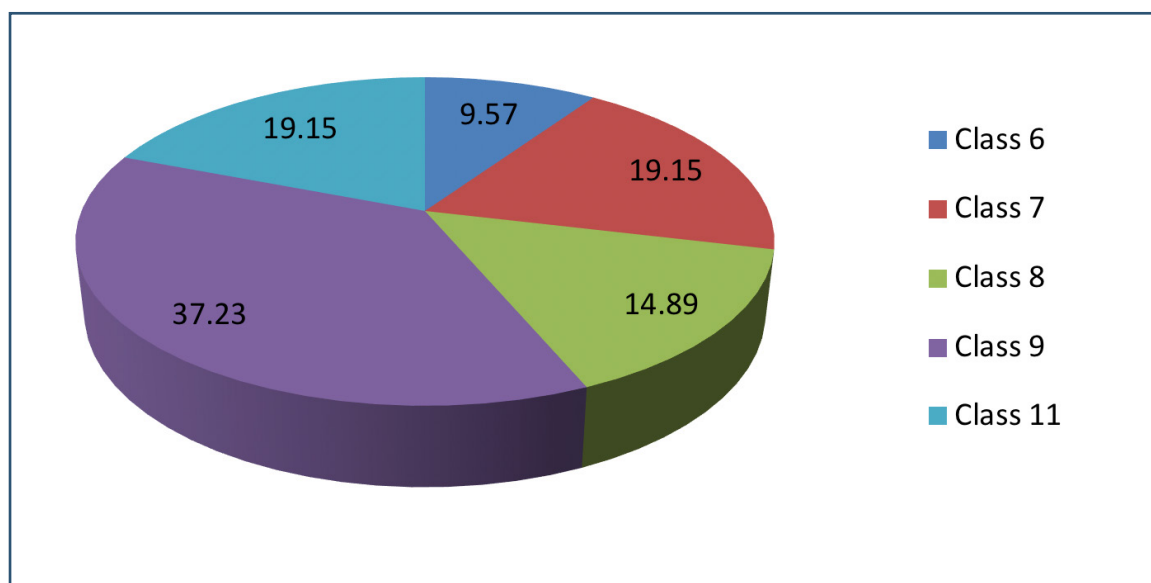
Figure-3: Details of recording of ISL programmes during October-December 2021 (Total no.=670)

Radio, Community Radio and Podcast

PM eVIDYA venture also offers educational e-contents (especially audio programmes) on radio platforms; both traditional radio e.g. FM as well as online radio e.g. podcast. Radio and podcasts are aimed to serve the children lacking proper ICT infrastructure. The dissemination/broadcast of these programmes is done on 230 Radio Stations (18 Gyan Vani FM Radio Stations, 80 Community Radio Stations, 132 All India Radio) and Podcasts on iRadio and JioSaavn Mobile apps. Till December 2021, 3,297 pieces of curriculum-based radio programmes (Classes 1-12) have been disseminated for broadcast. A total of 617 Live Programs have been broadcast through iRadio and JioSaavn apps. 18 Gyan Vani FM Radio Stations (Frequency 105.6 MHz) telecast different educational audio programmes as given in table-6 and a MoU with IGNOU was signed on 8 October 2021 for radio broadcast on Gyan Vani.

There are 80 Community Radio Stations (CRSs) all across the country where the audio programmes of PM eVIDYA are being broadcast. The frequency of these stations' broadcasts ranges between 97.4 to 107.8 MHz. A list of the radio stations is given in Table-7.

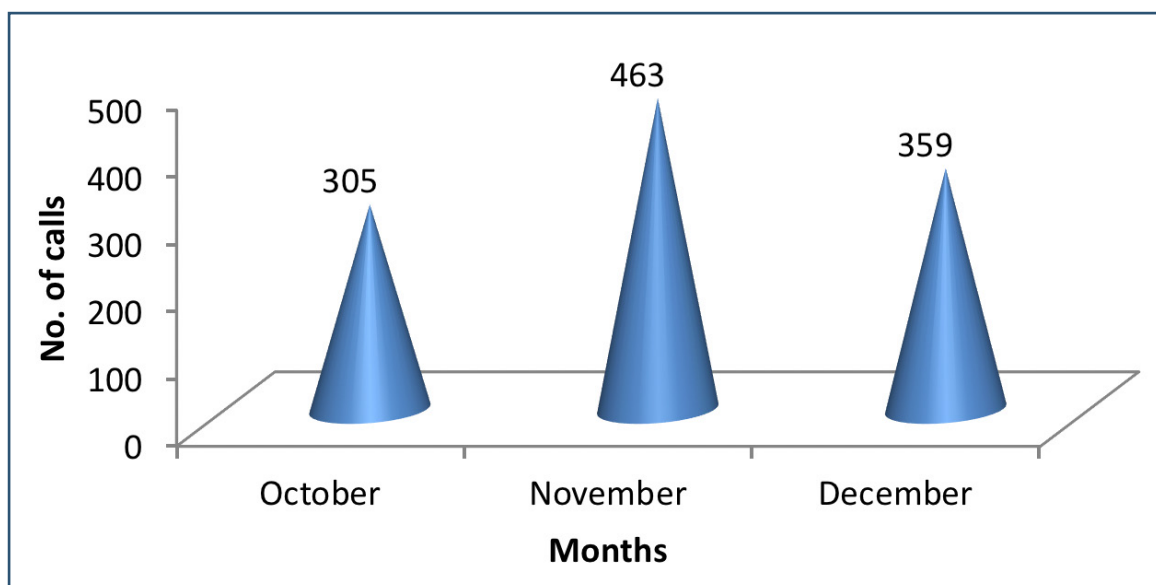

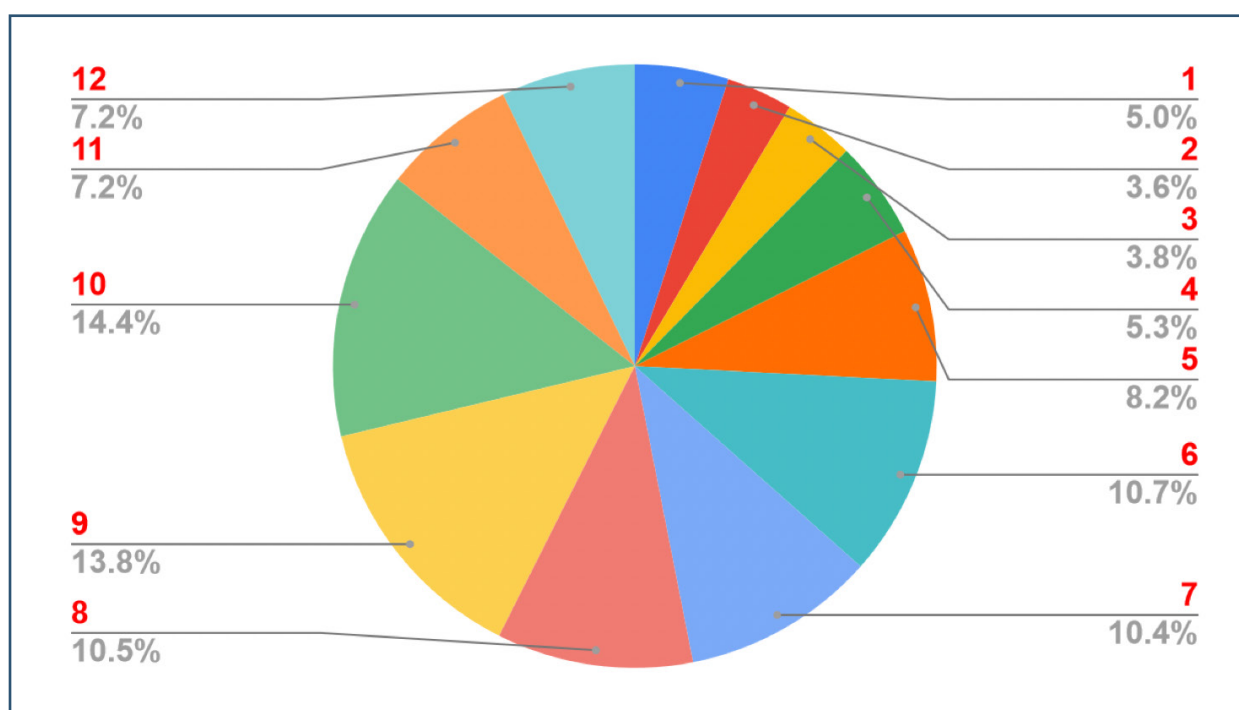

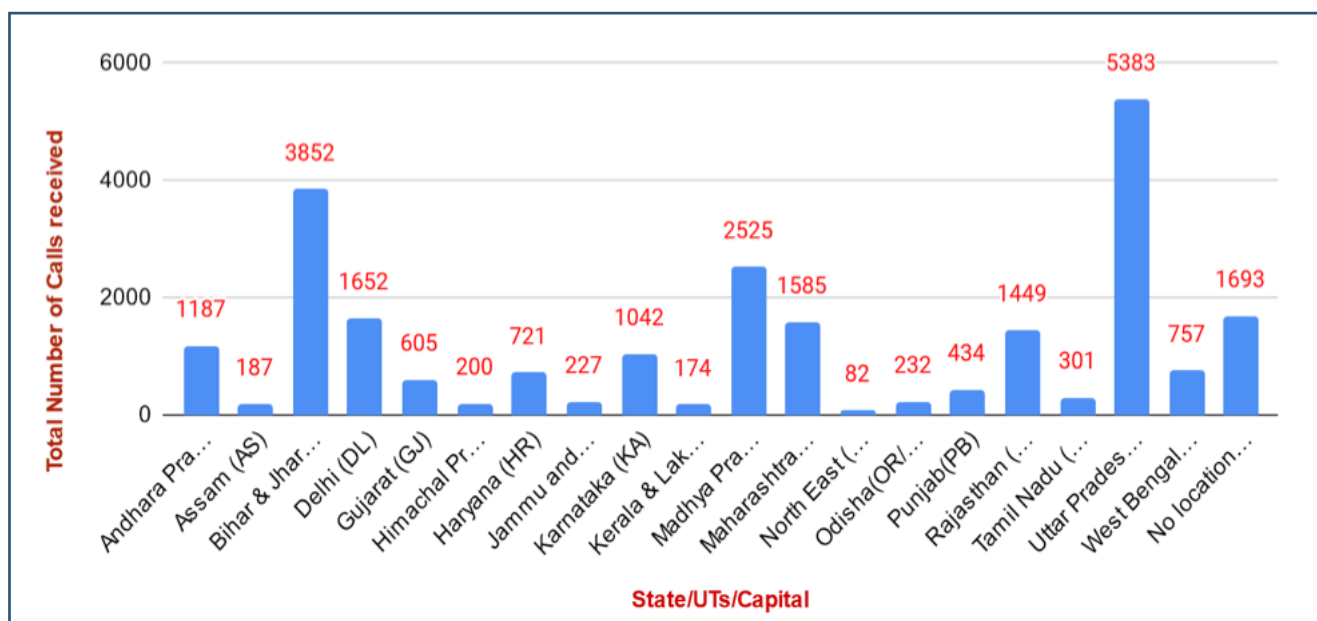

Figure-7: Details of queries received for PM eVIDYA as per Classes during October-December 2021



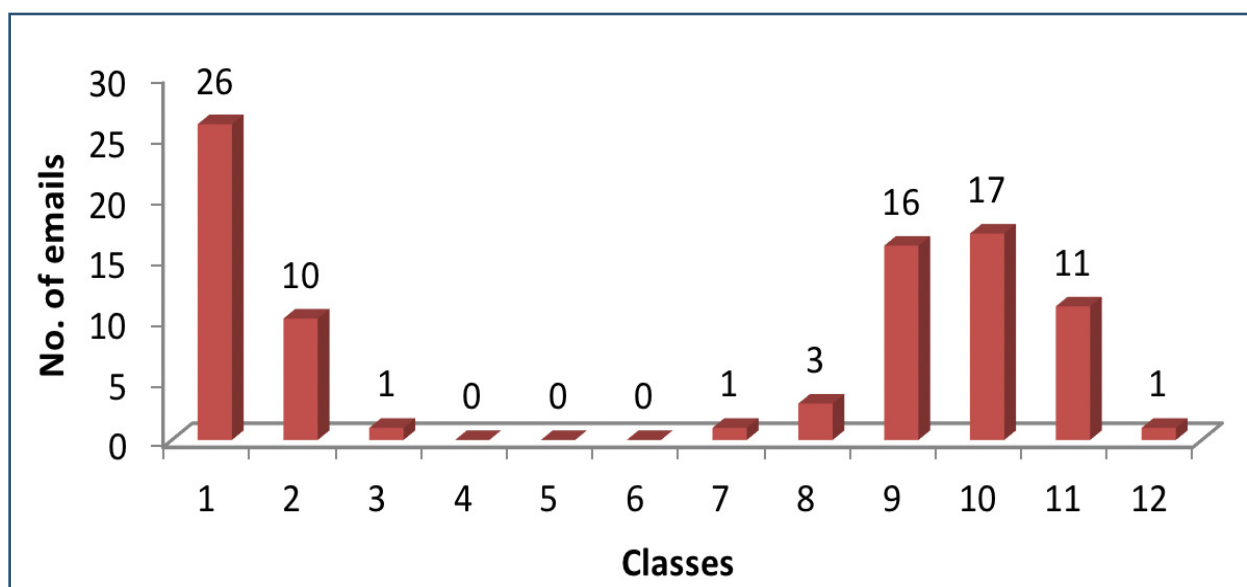

Figure-9: Details of emails received for PM eVIDYA channels according to classes during October-December 2021



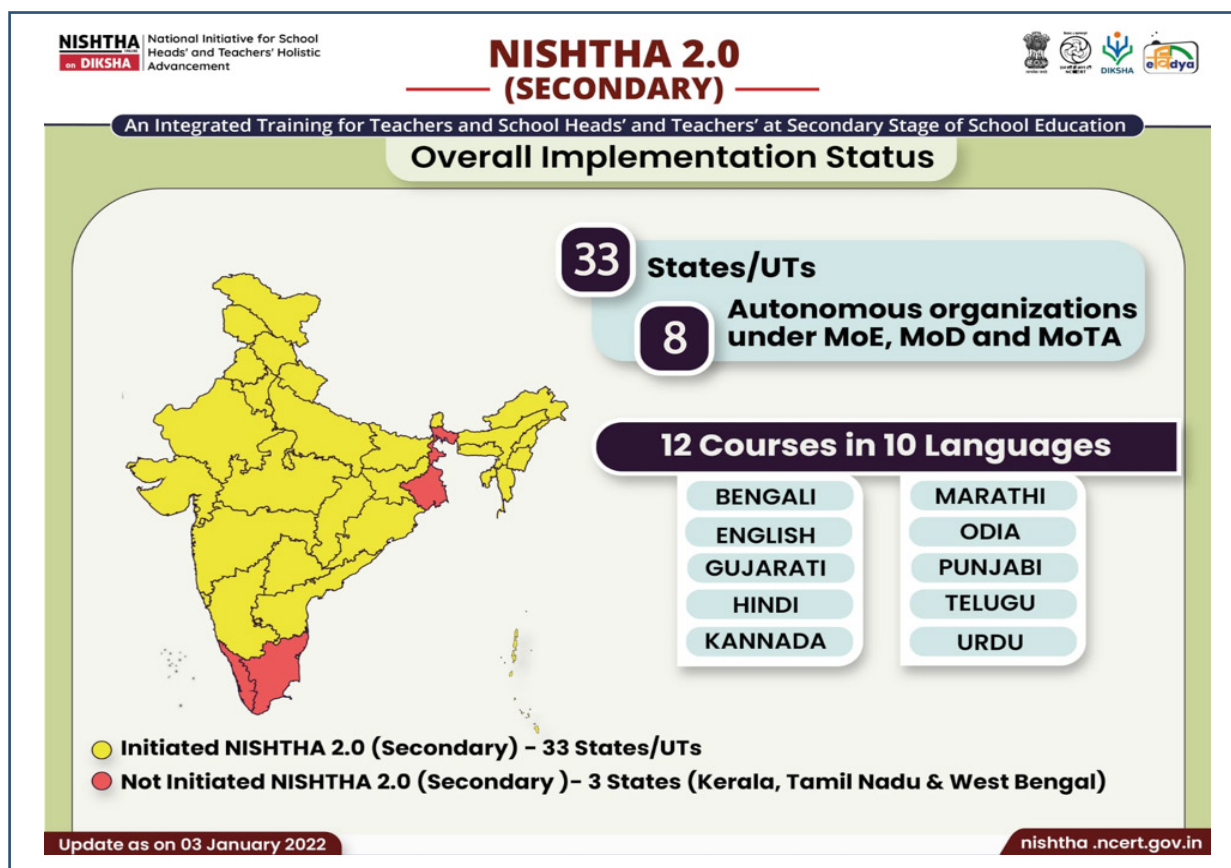
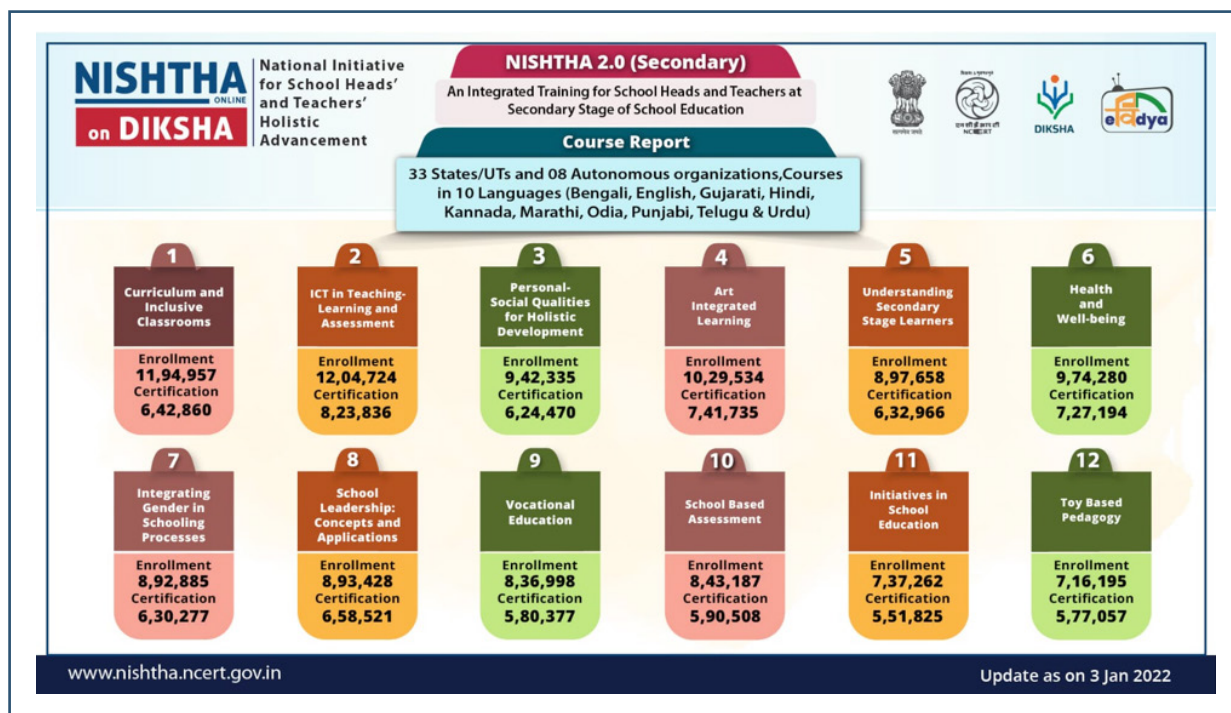

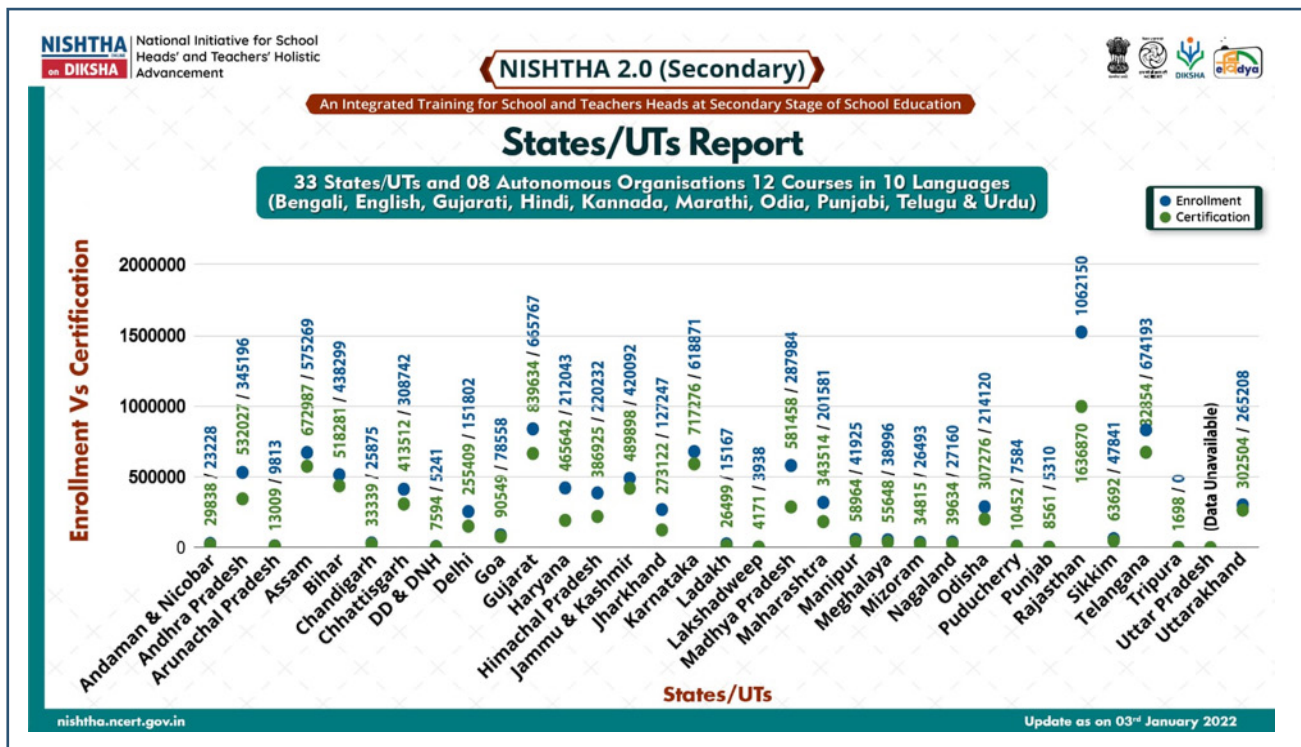

NISHTHA

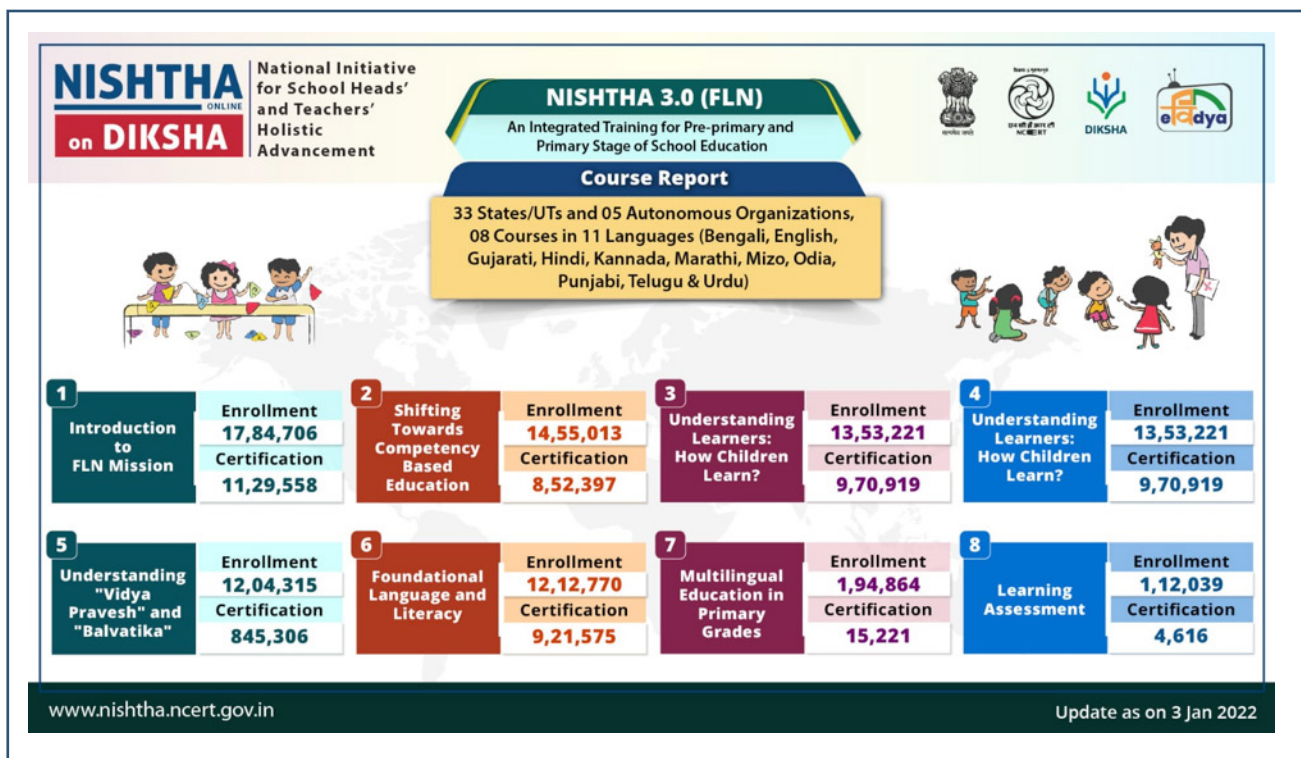
NCERT under the aegis of the Ministry of Education, the Government of India launched the National Initiatives for School Heads and Teachers Holistic Development (NISHTHA) 2.0 (Secondary) on 29 July 2021.

NISHTHA 2.0 (Secondary) is initiated by 32 states/ UTs and 7 autonomous organizations in 9 languages- English, Hindi, Urdu, Gujarati, Punjabi, Telugu, Kannada, Bengali, and Odia. The first three secondary courses are launched in August on the DIKSHA Platform, followed by the second three courses in September.
