

Book v/s eBook

A book is a medium for **recording information** in the form of **writing or images**, typically composed of **many pages** bound together and protected by a **cover**.

An electronic book / e-book / eBook, is a book publication made available in **digital form**, consisting of **text**, **images**, **or both**, readable on the **flat-panel display** of computers or other electronic devices.





Captain Cook's 'Discovery'

Captain James Cook "discovered" Australia in 1770, he sailed into Botany Bay on the Endeavour.

He made detailed Maps of Newfoundland prior to making three voyages to the Pacific Ocean, during which he achieved the first recorded European contact with the eastern coastline of Australia and the Hawaiian Islands, and the first recorded circumnavigation





FIRST FLEET

The First Fleet is the name given to the 11 ships which left Great Britain on 13 May 1787 to for colony that became the first European settlement in Australia.

The first fleet consisted of two Royal Navy vessels, three store ships transports, carrying more than 1,000 convicts, marines and seamen of stores.



The Invasion of Normandy

The Invasion of Normandy, also more commonly known as D-day, took place on June 6, 1944. The invasion took place in Europe, and is credited to be the beginning of the end in Europe. D-day was an invasion by the western Allied forces in Normandy, and is the largest amphibious invasion in history. The Allied forced needed this to work, so they rehearsed their D-day roles for months before the attack. The invasion began with overnight glider and parachute landings, along with air attacks and naval bombardments. The invasion fleet was taken from 8 separate navies. Putting up about 7,000 vessels, 1,200 warships, 4,000 transport vessels, 700 ancillary craft, and 860 merchant vessels. D-day was the biggest land, air, and sea attack prior to and since this day. Sadly, we suffered almost 10 thousand casualties, with more than 4000 men dead. Thanks to good preparation and planning Europe had been severely hit.

Variables are named areas of computer memory which are reserved for use by a computer program.

They can hold one value of one data type.

For example a variable named **weekday** which holds **string** data types could be assigned the value "**Saturday**".



#DECLARE weekday : STRING
weekday = "Monday"

Variables

The data types are:

- String: Holds a sequence of alphanumeric characters e.g. "Saturday"
- Char: Holds one alphanumeric character e.g. "z"
- Integer: Holds whole numbers e.g. 42
- Real : Holds numbers which have a decimal point e.g. 42.75
- Boolean : Holds only two values True or False

English language as a literary magazine - Teachers can transform traditional writing assignments like creative writing, poetry by having the students work around a theme or topic of their choice & publish an ebook for a genuine audience outside their classroom.

Foreign languages through a tour guide - We should make assignments useful outside the classroom so students can make a guidebook for tourists in their second or third language.

Real world uses for Math - Students can make a book with step-by-step directions to solve equations with variables on each side.

Students can make a book to demonstrate their understanding of angles and where they see them in the real world.


