From the Joint Director's Desk

Dear Readers,

The second quarter of 2025 (April–June) marked steady and meaningful progress in CIET-NCERT's academic and digital initiatives under the guidance of DoSEL, MoE. Several flagship programmes, under PAC and PAB, moved forward with a strong focus on accessibility, teacher empowerment, and digital transformation. As per the approval of PAC and PAB, CIET will undertake 13 PAC and 14 PAB programs in the academic year 2025 -26. Of the 13 PAC programs, 04 are research-type, 05 are development-type, 01 is training-type, and 03 are extension-type programs. NCERT has allocated a budget of 10 Crore (10,00,00,000) for conducting PAC programs in the Financial year 2025-26. Under PAB, 504.46 Crore (50,44,60,000) has been allocated.

The PM eVidya initiative remained a cornerstone, ensuring seamless management and monitoring of 200 DTH TV channels. During the quarter, over 3,500 e-content items were developed and disseminated through various media platforms. Multiple training sessions and workshops were also conducted to strengthen State and UT contributions, and live sessions continued to engage diverse learner groups.

On the DIKSHA platform, significant developments included, the creation of over 2,500 LO-based assessments for classes 9 and 10, pilot testing of the Personalised Adaptive Learning (PAL) system, and enhanced virtual lab offerings. Translation and accessibility features were improved, while States like West Bengal and Andhra Pradesh were onboarded on the new LMS.

The Vidya Samiksha Kendra (VSK) continued deepening data integration across KPIs, student-teacher attendance, and assessment dashboards. New portals and VSK coordination tools were developed and pilot-tested, with the NIOS VSK launched in June.

Capacity-building remained a priority through CPD initiatives, nano courses, and NISHTHA modules. Training were conducted on cyber safety, OER, and the power of audio in education. Workshops for educational media script development and textbook translation in 22 languages were also held, alongside the launch of 13 regional language primers.

We also furthered the development of digital textbooks with Universal Design of Learning (UDL), virtual labs, and curriculum-aligned VR environments. In line with the NEP 2020 vision, development of UDL-based digital textbooks, virtual reality content, and SCF hosting through the NCF-Tech platform continued. Projects like SHVR 2025, NEeC, MOOCs on SWAYAM, and the translation of DIKSHA content across languages were also advanced under PAB-approved activities.

We thank all our collaborators and stakeholders whose support has been vital in driving these efforts. As we move ahead, our shared goal remains to foster an inclusive, engaging, and future-ready learning ecosystem.

Under the study titled **“A Study of the Effectiveness of eJaadui Pitara on the Foundation Literacy and Numeracy”** a thorough review of related literature was conducted, covering 15 key sources to support the research framework. Following this, the first draft of the tool construction was completed. Currently, the development of the training module is underway, progressing in alignment with the initial research and tool design.

Under the study titled **“An Exploratory Study on Open Educational Resources: Policies, Practices, Awareness and Attitudes of Teachers and Teacher Educators”** an extensive reading on OER (Open Educational Resources) policy was undertaken. In addition, a review of 50 relevant research articles was conducted, with abstracts written for each to summarize key findings and insights, forming a strong foundation for further study

Under the study **“ A Study on Awareness on Cyber Safety and Security Among Secondary Stage”** Review of 10 research articles was done to gain comprehensive insights into emerging risks, challenges and effective strategies for ensuring children’s safety online.

Under the programme **“Development of Educational Audio/Video Programme Scripts for School, Teacher, and Adult Education”**, during this period, two five days workshop details are as follows :-

Development and Dissemination of Short-Term Multilingual professional development courses using Google tools to strengthen TPACK (Technology Pedagogical Content Knowledge) of School Teachers,

A literature review was undertaken to plan course structure for TPACK courses, supported by the development of a comprehensive content coverage checklist. Content planning meetings were conducted through Canva and Google Teams, culminating in the signing of an MoU with Canva. The finalized content underwent alpha testing with teachers and teacher educators in Sikkim to gather insights for refinement.

Under the programme, **Development and dissemination of Virtual Content showcasing India’s diverse Art and Culture**, a comprehensive literature review was conducted to explore best practices in virtual content platforms for arts and culture. As a part of this initiative, the team engaged with the Google Arts and Culture team and the Amar Chitra Katha team to identify possibilities for content synergy and collaboration.

Under the programme “Capacity Building on Cyber Safety and Security” a need analysis was conducted to design training initiatives. As a part of this effort, five hours of training on “safety in cyberspace” and “Social Media Safety” were organized in both English and Hindi versions to ensure wider accessibility. Further, nano courses on these topics were developed and launched in both languages.

Under the programme “**Faculty Development Programme in ICT and Emerging Technologies for Teachers, Teacher Educators and Pupil Teachers in Teacher Education Institution**”, Planning meetings were held to streamline the execution of upcoming projects. As part of these preparatory efforts, a comprehensive form was designed to collect information about resource persons for invited lectures.

Resource-cum-Activity Centre in ET/ICT for School and Teacher Education, during the quarter, eight exposure visits were organized, engaging 388 students and 35 teachers along with delegates from various institutions and countries. Additionally, around 20 students from University of Allahabad and BHU successfully completed their internships. Further one exposure visit included the 20 delegates from Sri Lanka. In the subsequent series of seven exposure visits, 40 students and 283 teachers with delegates from diverse institutions and countries participated.

Online Publication of Indian Journal of Educational Technology and Quarterly Newsletter of CIET, the editorial process for the July 2025 issue is underway. Manuscripts were screened for the plagiarism, with rejections issued where necessary. Reviewed and revised reports were compiled and are now in the final stages of proofreading and copy editing.

PM eVidya Management of 200 DTH TV channels and Radio Broadcasts and Podcast, From April to June 2025, the management of 200 DTH TV channels under PM eVidya continues to ensure seamless educational broadcasting for students. Transmission Schedules for classes 1-12 for quarter period have been shared with BISAG-N, Gandhinagar, facilitating uninterrupted telecast on DD Free Dish and simultaneous streaming on YouTube. During the period, a total of 1,794 eContents with 598 hours for May, 877 eContents with 340 hours for June and 1,234 eContent for 482 hours for July were contributed by various states, UTs and autonomous bodies. Additionally, a VIS workshop for Maharashtra was conducted online on 16th May 2025, and training programme on eContent Development was organized for Odisha from 26th to 30th May 2025.

Under **“PM eVidya Development of Curriculum Based AR/VR and Virtual labs”**, the team successfully mapped and uploaded 30 Vocational Skills Labs on DIKSHA and reviewed 30 O labs with 20 already uploaded. Development includes 2 Virtual lab simulations in mathematics (Class X) and Chemistry (Class XI), 7 nano courses across Languages, Social Science, and core science, also 9VR Lab environments in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, and Computer Science. A proposed UI/UX for Virtual tour development was initiated. Additionally, 24 online training sessions were conducted for middle and secondary stages covering all subjects, along with 52 social media advocacy posts to promote Virtual Labs. Few scripts and storyboards for Physics and computer science virtual labs are under review.

Under the project **“PM eVidya Organization of eContent Competition for creation of quality digital contents”** witnessed a significant progress with the creation of metadata for the winning programmes and their subsequent upload on the NCERT Official YouTube Channel. The comprehensive report of AICEeCC 2024-25 was compiled. A revised proposal, concept note, guidelines, and metadata for the past three editions along with details of producers, Model content developed by CIET, and presentation about the plan for NEeC 2025-26 were submitted for approval. Furthermore, a virtual Meeting with the Director, Digital Education was held on 17 June 2025 to present the proposed plan for NEeC 2025-26 and testing of the Portal developed to facilitate the application process for NEeC 2025-26 was initiated.

In the programme **“NCFs – Technology Platform”**, during the period, progress has been made on the development of the State Curricular Frameworks (SCFs) across states and union territories. Chhattisgarh has released the SCF for the Foundational Stage and School Education, both of which have been uploaded to the NCF-Tech platform (<https://ncf.ncert.gov.in/#/web/documents>). Odisha has committed to adopting the NCF with local contextualisation as its SCF, while Nagaland hosted an SCF-FS integration workshop to align with NEP 2020. Meghalaya has initiated work on SCF-SE, with finalisation expected soon. In Jammu & Kashmir, the SCF-FS in collaboration with JK-BoSE and JK-SCERT has been finalised and uploaded on the website, incorporating local contextualisation and suggestions from SCERT and JK-BoSE. Additionally, the constitution of Textbook Development Teams (TDTs) for Grades 9 and 10 in science, mathematics, arts education, vocational studies, and physical education and well-being, as well as for Grades 11 and 12 in Hindi, Sanskrit, and Urdu, has been notified through the NCF-Tech platform.

Under the project **“Development of Digital textbooks based on Universal Design of Learning (UDL) “Kitaab ek, Padhe Anek”**, The development and refinement of accessible learning materials progressed significantly during this period. The touch points for Class 2 Joyful Mathematics (English Medium) were finalised and shared with the audio team, while corrections from earlier touch point-wise audio recordings for Class 1 were reviewed. Audio files for Class 1 textbooks Sarangi, Mridang, and Anandmayi Ganit were received, reviewed, and necessary observations shared with the audio team. Additionally, Braille content for Class 1 Joyful Mathematics was verified by experts post receipt of the design file, and the process for UV design has been initiated. Updates in the latest editions of Class 1 and 2 textbooks were reviewed to ensure corresponding audio modifications.

Under the programme **“PM e-Vidya Continuous Professional Development (CPD) through NISHTHA -Educational Technology”** significant progress was made in the review and development of NISHTHA content and programmes.

Under the project **“Capacity Building for Transforming Teachers into Digital Teachers”**, Substantial advancements were made . A comprehensive review of literature and need analysis was done. Five-hour training sessions on The Power of Audio in Education and Open Educational Resources (OER): Innovating Education were successfully conducted in both English and Hindi. Corresponding nano courses in English and Hindi were launched . Additionally, four generic CPD online courses are currently being offered. A face-to-face training session on OER was organised for teacher educators from southern states, benefitting 45 participants

Figure -1 : Number of visitors on website till June 2025

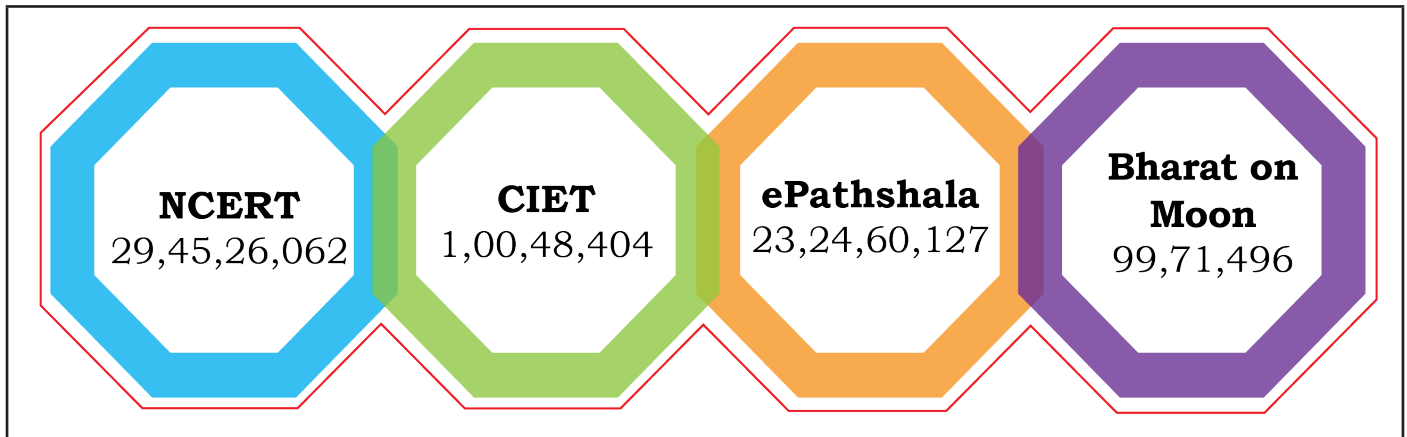
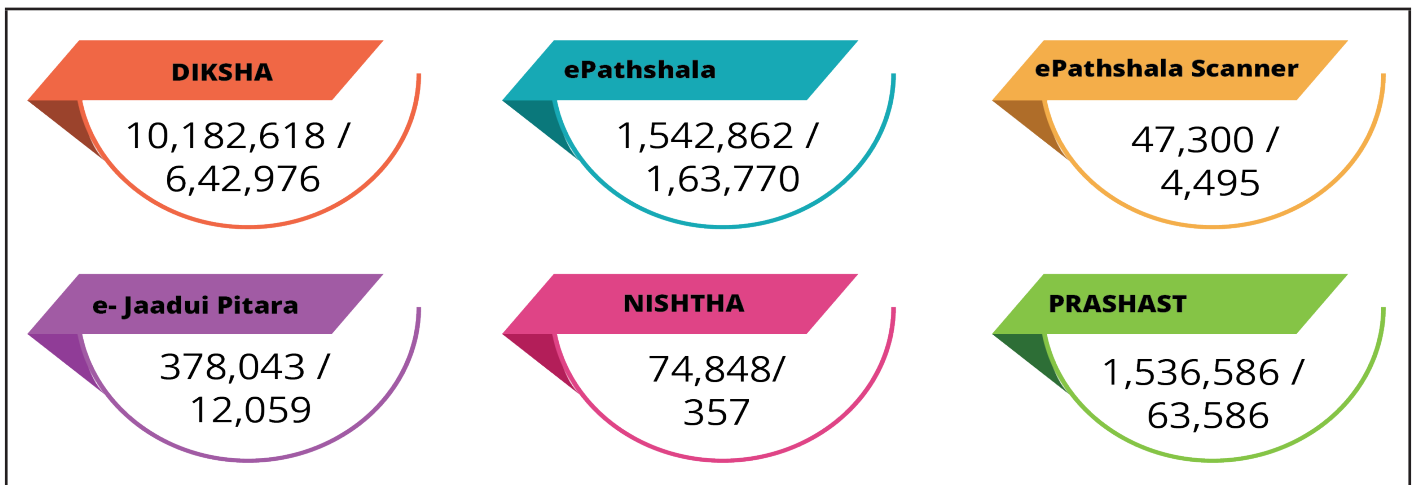


Figure 2 : Mobile Apps with Installed Audience between April - June 2025

COMMUNITY RADIO AND PODCAST

Radio programs contain mainly the programs based on some of the chapters of the new NCERT textbooks in which songs on nation, science quiz for younger groups, short tribal and folk stories from different parts of Bharat, inclusive education and environmental awareness etc. are included.

Moreover, the program contains a segment in which short information about scheduled languages of India, states of India, continents; NEP etc. are given followed by the questions. Sizeable numbers of listeners do respond to the questions.

Umang broadcasts 5 days a week from different radio stations of All India Radio across the country.

A good feedback is received in response to the broadcast to NCERT through e-mail and IVRS phone calls. The Umang program has made a good impact among blind listeners. Umang has also made an impact on school teachers.

Audio programmes are also being shared with Community Radio Stations and IGNOU Gyanvani stations.

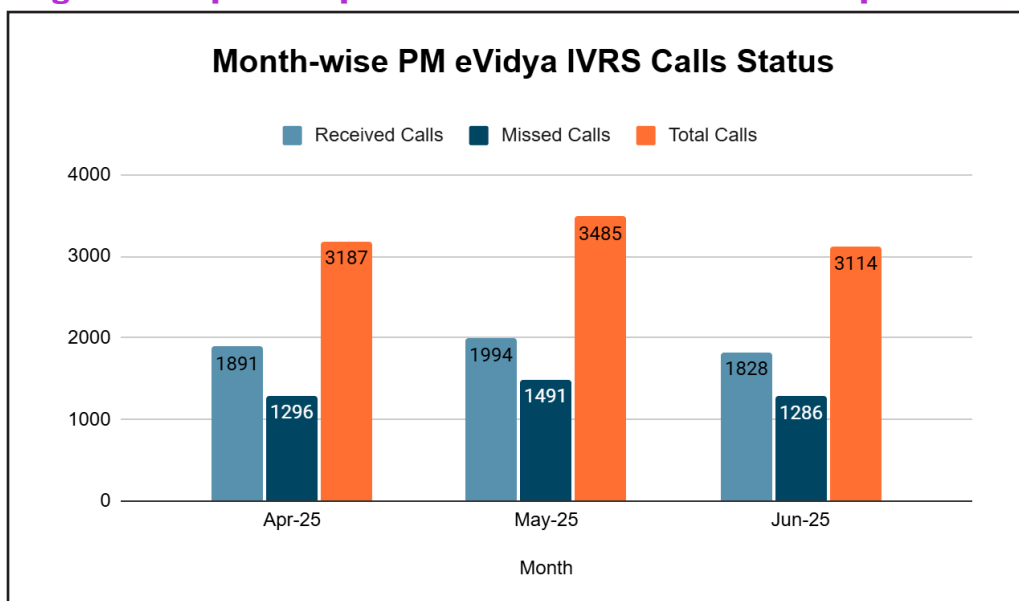

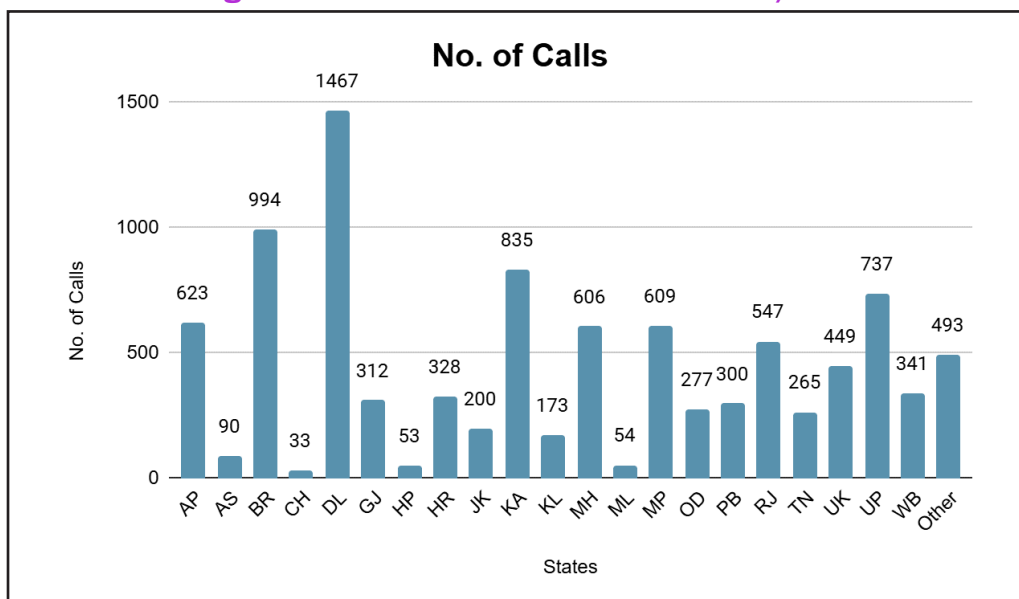

Figure-3: Details of IVRS calls from States/UTs



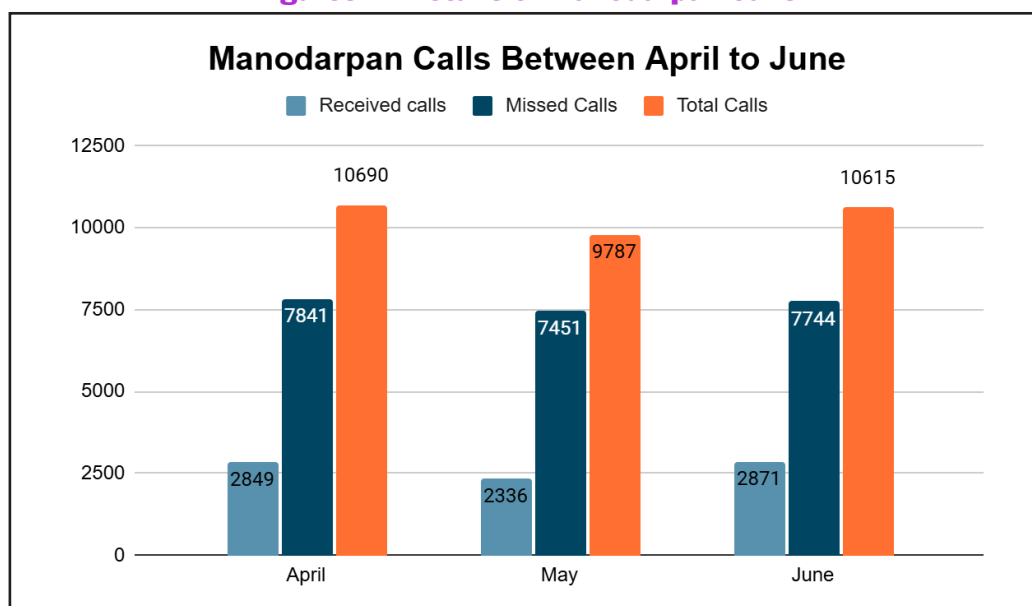

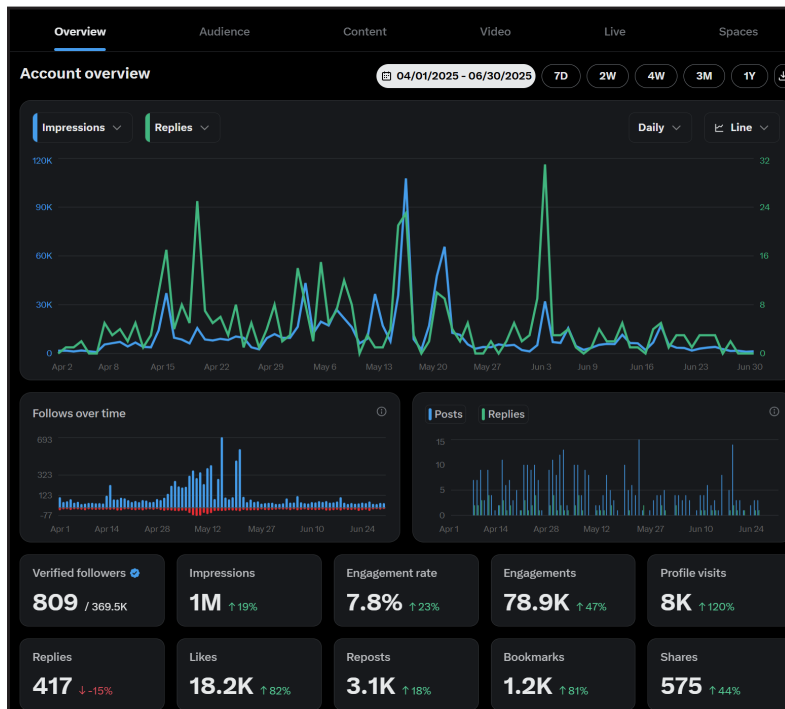

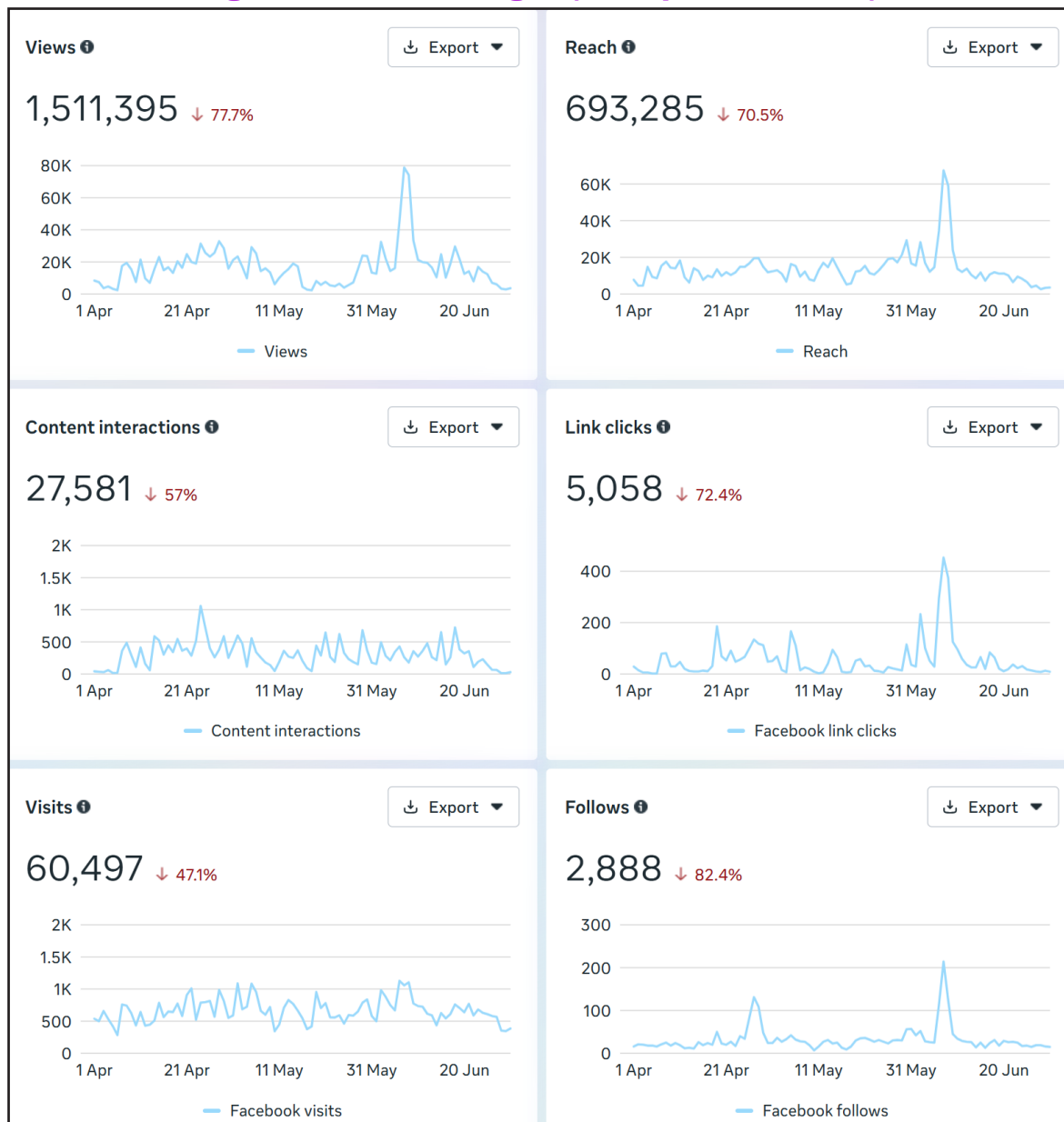

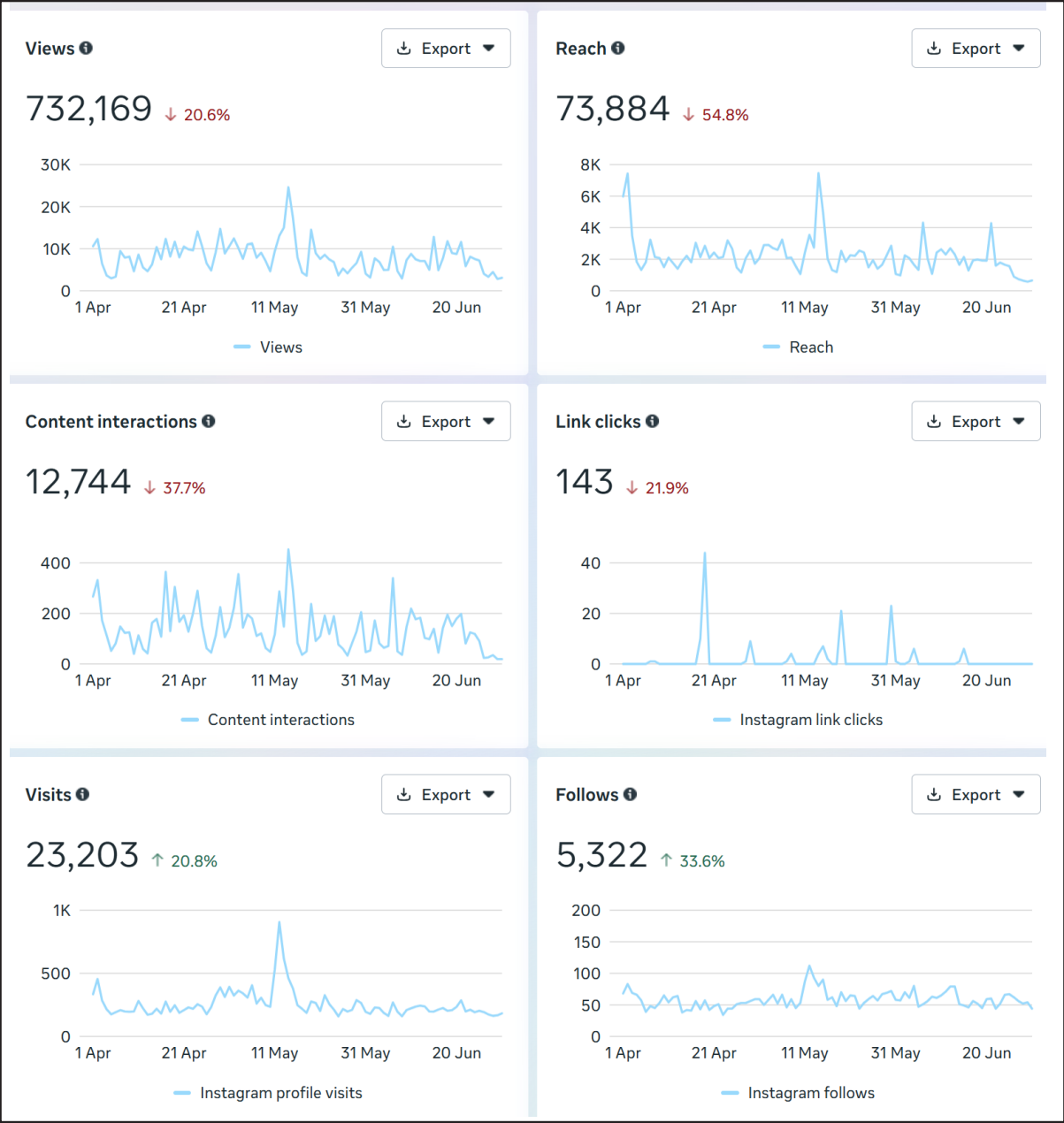
