Research

Under the study titled as **Effectiveness of PM e-Vidya Video content on Student’s achievement at Secondary Level**, focuses on assessing the impact of PM e-Vidya’s video content on student learning outcomes. During July-September 2024, the project made significant strides, including the development and standardization of research tools such as perception scales, reaction scales, and achievement tests in science. Data collection began at key centers, including RIE Ajmer, RIE Bhopal, and KV Sec-2 RK Puram, with pre-achievement tests and perceptions from students and teachers being recorded. The project team also held meetings with local coordinators and monitored progress closely to ensure smooth execution of the study’s first phase across multiple states. Further adjustments are being planned based on the preliminary data analysis.

Under the study titled as **Effectiveness of AR and VR Content on Students’ Learning Outcomes in Science and Mathematics at Secondary Level**, the next steps include finalizing and piloting the research tools that were developed during this period, such as the visual spatial memory

tool, learner satisfaction tool, and scientific attitude test. The team will likely begin testing the effectiveness of AR and VR content in classrooms using these tools, collecting data from students and teachers. The project may also expand its focus to refine AR/VR content for additional topics or subjects based on feedback. Moreover, further workshops or training sessions for educators on using AR/VR in teaching may be organized to ensure smooth implementation in schools.

Development

Development of Educational Audio/Video Programme Scripts for School, Teacher, and Adult Education focuses on creating high-quality, pedagogically sound scripts for various educational levels. Between July and September 2024, multiple workshops were organized to develop scripts for subjects like English, Hindi, Mathematics, and Science. A total of 40 scripts were finalized and submitted for review. These efforts are crucial for creating engaging educational content that can be used across digital and broadcast platforms, ensuring broader reach and better learning outcomes.

Training

Under the programme, **Development of Digital Resources on Cyber Safety and Capacity Building**, webinars and online training sessions were conducted during July-September 2024. Details of webinars and online training sessions are given below.

Online Training:

- Conducted sessions on “Digital Wellness” in English (01-05 July) and Hindi (08-12 July).
- Courses launched on the DIKSHA portal on July 5 (English) and July 12 (Hindi).

Cyber Safety Training:

- Phase I was conducted from July 24-26 (English) and Phase II from July 29-31 (Hindi).

Financial Safety Training:

- Sessions held from August 5-9 (English) and August 12-16 (Hindi).

Micro Courses Launched:

- Financial Safety in Cyberspace: English (Aug 9) and Hindi (Aug 16).
- Significant enrollments and certifications achieved.

Micro Courses in Progress:

- Courses on Cyber Threats and Digital Wellness showing high enrollment and completion rates.
- Cyber Parenting courses launched in both languages with good engagement.

SRG Training on Cyber Safety & Security:

- Assessments for 708 participants completed, with 576 certificates issued.

Extension

Under the project titles as **“IEC in ET/ICT for School and Teacher Education”** educational/exposure visits were organised which benefitted students and faculty members/teachers/officials, and other delegates from SCERTs/SIEs, DIETs/BIETs, Universities etc. In the table below the key details of the educational exposure visits organized is provided.

In **Online Publication of Indian Journal of Educational Technology and Quarterly Newsletter of CIET**, during July to September 2024, significant progress was made in the journal and newsletter activities. An online review workshop for revised manuscripts was conducted, and the July issue of the journal was compiled and published, while acceptance letters were sent to authors, and similarity checks were performed on manuscripts. The team received manuscripts for the January 2025 issue and continued work on the OJS for the NCERT Journal. Additionally, the quarterly newsletter for April to June 2024 was published, and efforts for indexing the Indian Journal of Educational Technology (IJET) with SCOPUS were initiated, alongside testing the OJS to enhance journal operations.

The achievements and activities of the **“PM eVidya DIKSHA – One Nation One Platform”** are elaborated as below:

General Statistics:

- Average daily page hits on DIKSHA exceeded 72 lakhs.
- A total of 6,709 energized textbooks available on DIKSHA, including 422 ETBs of NCERT.
- 3,53,566 e-content resources are available on DIKSHA in 84 languages (77 Indian + 7 foreign).

EPUB Conversion Status

- Class 3 and Class 6 textbooks are undergoing EPUB conversion, with several completed and others in progress.

eContent for Children with Special Needs (CWSN)

- Developed and uploaded 4,433 audiobook chapters and 954 textbook-based ISL videos on DIKSHA.

Verticals on DIKSHA

- Inclusive and Equitable Education: Development of a vertical is underway.
- FLN Vertical: 2,778 resources uploaded, with 5,92,129 plays and 4,44,587 minutes of engagement.
- Education For All Vertical: 1,107 resources uploaded, with 40,148 plays and 50,607 minutes of engagement.
- Virtual Labs Vertical: 280 science experiments uploaded, with 1,85,254 plays and 2,44,143 minutes of engagement.
- Vocational Education Vertical: 877 e-contents available, with 11,406 plays and 29,848 minutes of engagement.

Social Media Engagement:

- A total of 549 posts made across three social media handles.

New Textbooks and eContent Uploads:

- Uploaded 3 new Class 3 textbooks and 2 new Class 6 textbooks.
- Developed and uploaded 606 e-contents, 5 audiobook chapters, and 25 primers.

Coordination Meetings:

- 3 monthly DIKSHA coordination meetings held for progress updates and planning.

Enrollment and Certification:

- Total enrollment in Generic CPD courses reached 5,74,555, with 3,17,813 certifications issued.

New DIKSHA LMS Features:

- Introduced features for course scheduling, assignment management, and user interface updates.

Vidya Samiksha Kendra (RVSK):

- Operationalized 31 VSKs including 1 additional state/UT (Lakshadweep) and completed API integration for near real-time attendance for teachers and students in 23 states/UTs.

Training Package Development:

- Ongoing development and revisions for MOOCs on the development of online courses, with several modules in various stages of completion.

Under the project titled as **“PM eVidya Development of Curriculum Based AR/VR and Virtual labs”**, two scripts for virtual reality (VR) in Mathematics and Physics have been finalized, and the development process for these scripts has begun. A review of nine experiments provided by Embibe under the TechDaan initiative has been completed. Additionally, a video conference was held to discuss the Vocational Education vertical, and a metadata sheet was created to rearrange Vocational Education resources, which has been shared with PSSCIVE. A ticket has also been raised for user interface changes in the DIKSHA Virtual Labs to address issues such as overlapping menu bars that hide question and answer options, as well as repositioning the Tara bot. A five-day workshop on the development of augmented reality (AR), VR, and Virtual Labs content was organized, leading to the creation of a proposal for AR applications. Furthermore, AR and VR content for science scripting and storyboarding has been identified, with ongoing live training for virtual labs in Biology and Chemistry, along with the development of two scripts and storyboards for Biology for Class IX.

Under the initiative titled as **“PM eVidya Organization of Festival, ICT Mela, contests of digital contents and coordination with States/ UTs”**, a list of panelists is being curated, and the portal for the contest is in the process of being developed. Additionally, planning for advertising the AICEeCC 2024-25 has commenced, ensuring effective outreach and engagement. With these preparations in place, the AICEeCC 2024-25 is set to be officially announced soon, aiming to promote excellence in digital content creation across educational platforms.

Under the initiative **“National Curriculum Framework – Technology Platform”** following activities are undertaken:

- The Jammu & Kashmir Board of School Education (JKBOSE) is working on the JKSCF and uploaded a draft for SCF-FS for inputs and suggestions.

Apart from it, NCERT has newly uploaded Class 3 and Class 6 textbooks, as well as Bridge Month Courses for Grade 6, based on NEP 2020, NCF-FS 2022, and NCF-FS 2023.

Under the project titled as “**Development of Digital textbooks based on Universal Design of Learning (UDL)**” Kitaab ek, Padhe Anek” in July, two workshops were conducted: the first from July 8 to 12 focused on feature mapping for Class 1 “Math Magic,” involving a team of four experts, while the second workshop, held from July 22 to 26, concentrated on features for Class 1 in both English and Hindi. In August, similar activities continued as in July. By September, the Class 1 mathematics textbook titled “Joyful Mathematics” (English Medium) was finalized, including audio output for all 13 chapters and the preliminary pages. The corresponding Excel file for these chapters has been shared with the audio division for processing. Additionally, only one tender was received for the tender uploaded on GEM, despite extending the deadline by 10 days. The SPS has been requested to initiate the procurement process without further extending the application deadline.

Under the initiative of PM e-Vidya Continuous Professional Development (CPD) through NISHTHA -Educational Technology various activities were undertaken.

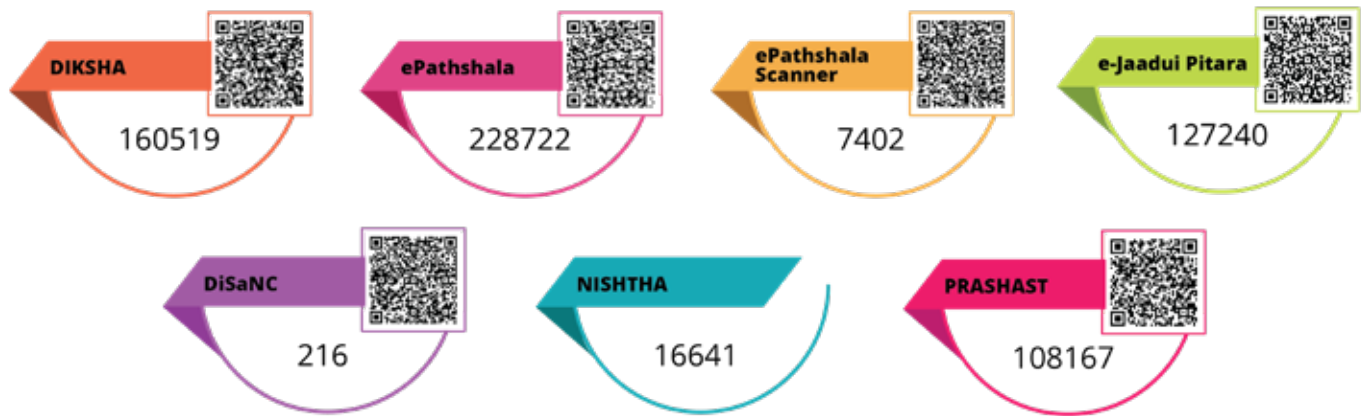


Figure 2 : Mobile Apps with Installed Audience Between July and September 2024

Under the initiative “**Development of MOOCs for ITEP on SWAYAM Platform**”, requested for Credit Transfer of Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) MOOC Courses on SWAYAM Platform – waiting for the reply of NCTE.

Under the initiative of “**Development of SWAYAM MOOCs on School Education**” as of July 22, 2024, the enrolment across these courses reached 34,669, which increased to 40,782 by August 28, 2024, and further to 41,865 by the end of September 2024. The assessments for these courses were reviewed and finalized by course coordinators, with assessments conducted from September 28 to 30, 2024. Additionally, the course structure content for these MOOCs was developed according to the National Curriculum Framework for School Education (NCFSE) for subjects such as Accountancy, Economics, Sociology, Mathematics, Business Studies, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology, and English. Meanwhile, content transfer for Cycle 14 is underway, with competency-based chapter-wise course development progressing for 8 subjects, and the first draft of two modules in each subject completed by the in-house team.

Community Radio and Podcast

Radio programs contains mainly the programs based on some of the chapters of the new NCERT textbooks in which songs on nation, science quiz for younger groups, short tribal and folk stories from different parts of Bharat, inclusive education and environmental awareness etc. are included.

Moreover, Program contains a segment in which short information about scheduled languages of India, states of India, continents; NEP etc. are given followed by the questions. Sizeable numbers of listeners do respond to the questions.

Umang broadcast 5 days a week from different radio stations of All India Radio across the country.

A good feedback is received in response to the broadcast to NCERT through e mail and IVRS phone calls. Umang program has made a good impact among blind listeners. Umang has also made impact on school teachers.

Audio programmes are also being shared with Community Radio Stations and IGNOU Gyanvani stations.

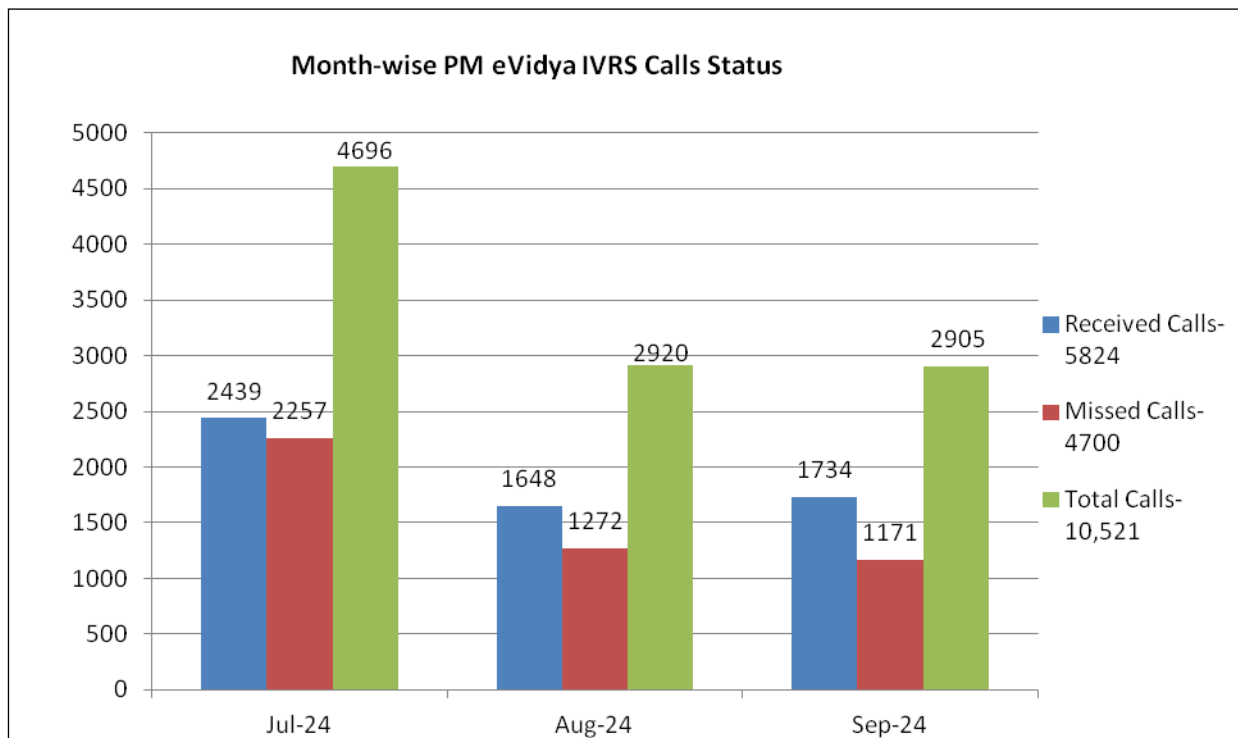


Figure-3 : Details of IVRS Call Data

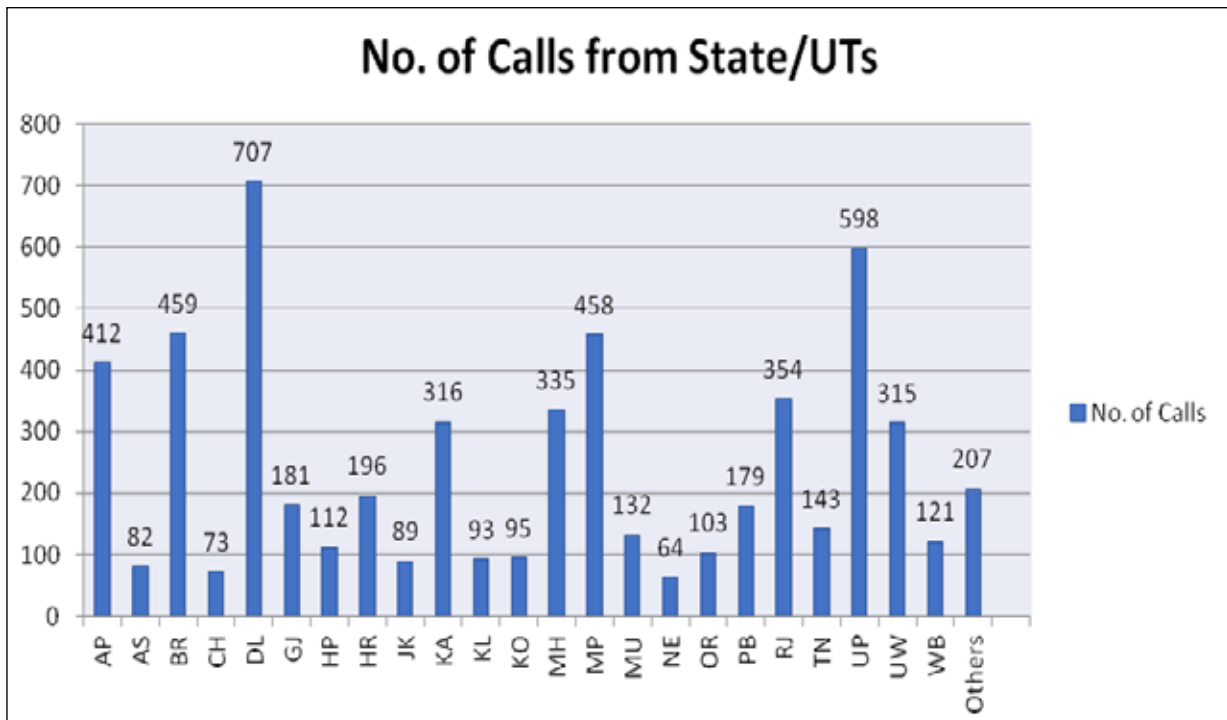


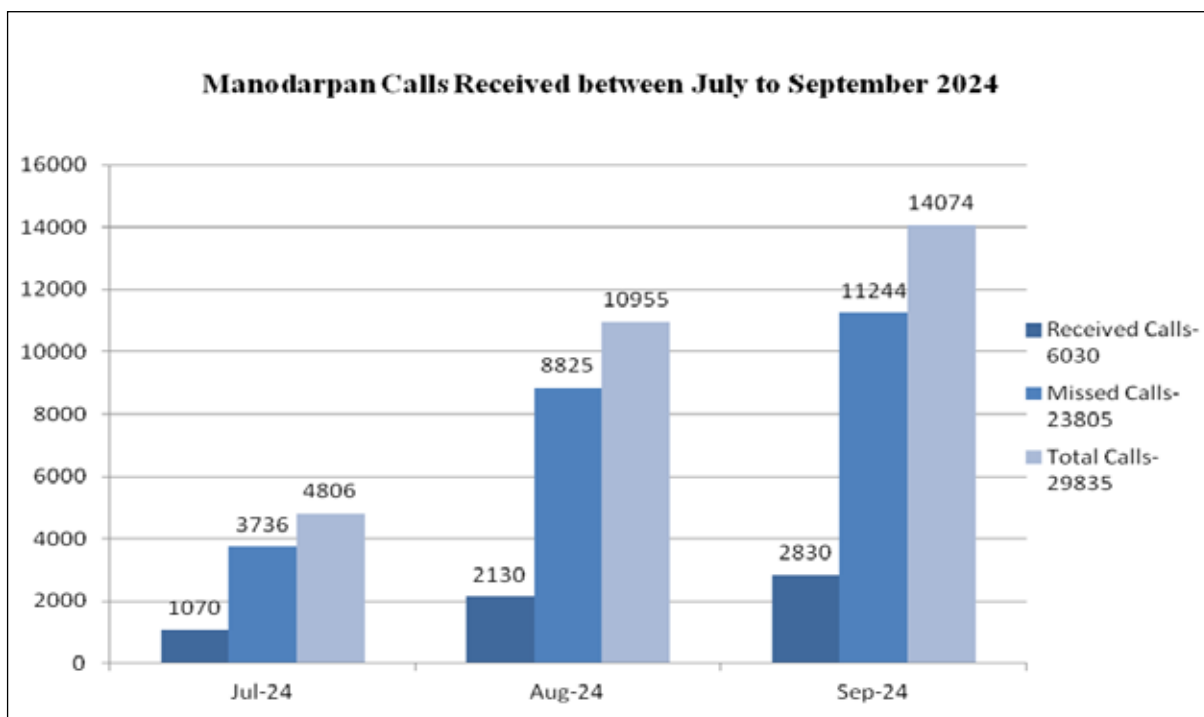
Figure-4 : Details of IVRS calls from States/UTs

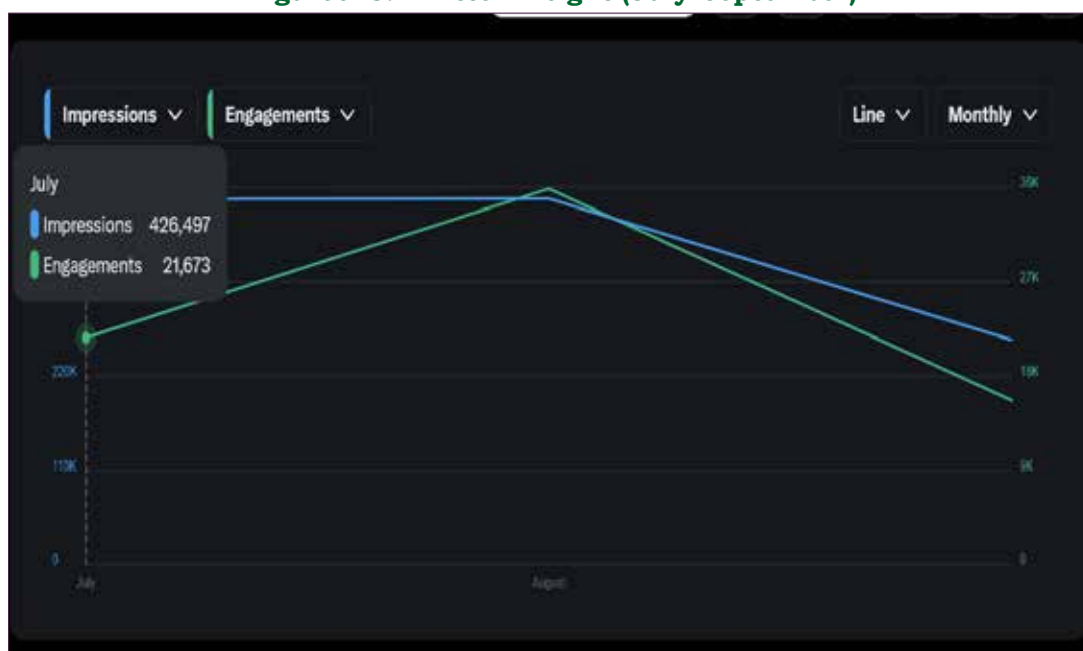

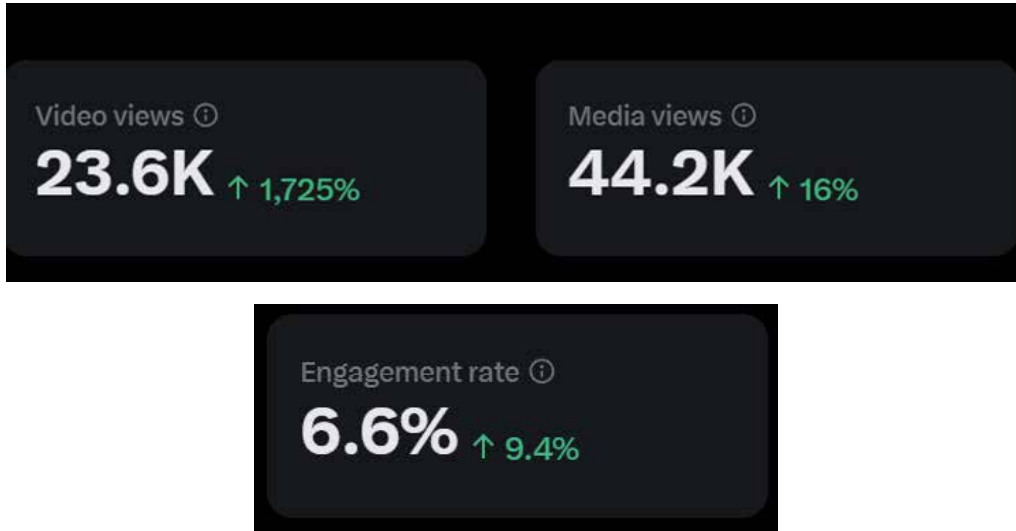

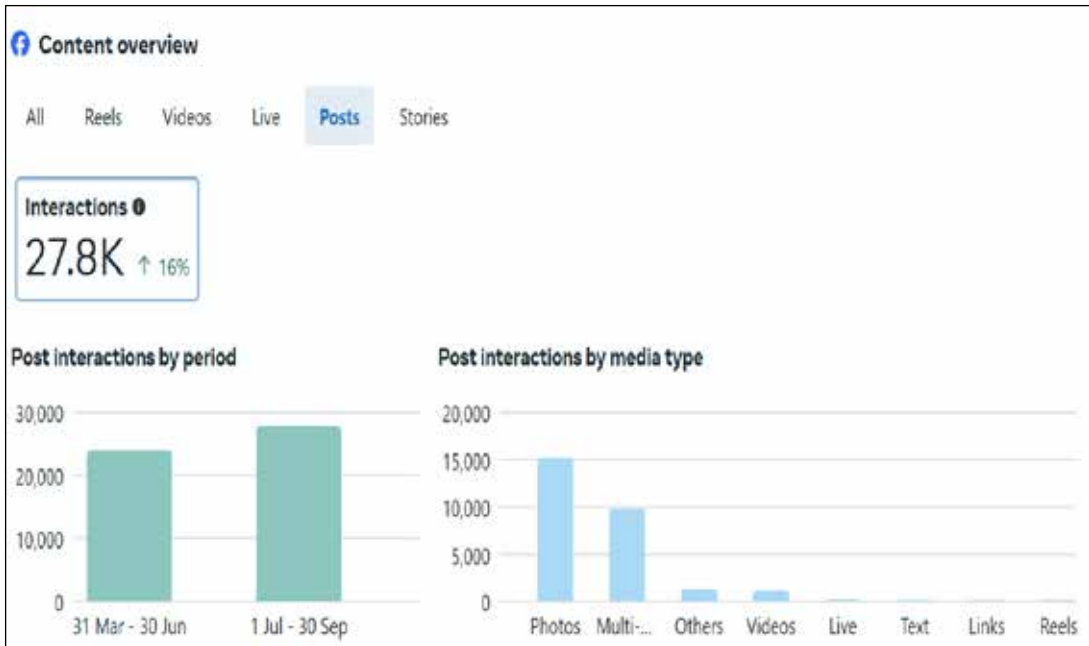

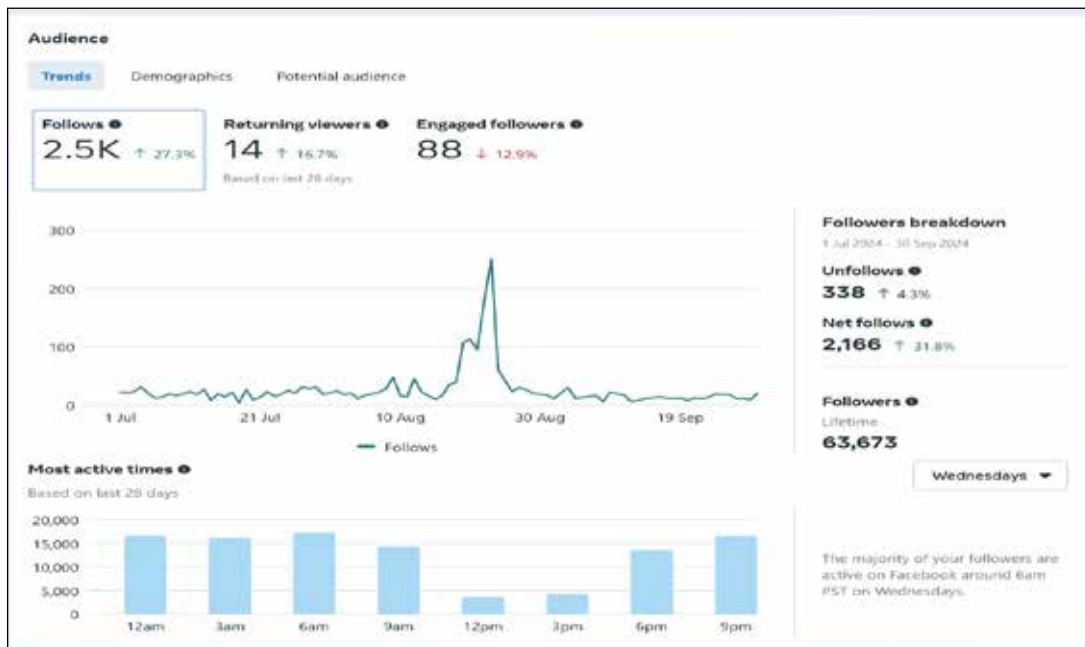
