## Training Programmes for States/Uts : A step towards personalized learning

After the launch of National Repository of Open Educational Resources (NROER) on August 13, 2013, it has taken a leap towards reaching one and all in all the States/UTs of India to provide a platform for more personalized learning for teachers and students. A series of training programmes were organized for core team from each and every State/UTs of India in different phases. These core team members were selected by the State's competent authorities from different educational institutions and organization like schools, boards, SCERTs/SIEs, RMSA, SSA, DIETs, CTEs/IASEs, SIETs, universities etc. The groups of the participants were quite heterogeneous in terms of their academic backgrounds and area of work too. They were teachers, teacher educators, subject experts, trainers etc. who have expertise and been involved with various activities in the school system including the development of e-content and professional development of teachers. There were Directors, Assistant Directors, Principals, Readers, Lecturers, Assistant Professors, Academic Officers, BRTEs (Block Resource Teacher Educators), BT Assistants, PGTs (Post Graduate Teachers), TGTs, Senior Teacher Educators, Demonstrators, Assistant Teachers, Ph.D. scholars etc.

Starting from March 18 to August 29, 2014, seven phases of one week training programmes were organized at CIET, NCERT, New Delhi for 348 core team members from 34 States/UTs to equip them with the necessary know how to participate and contribute in NROER.

Training was given in different sessions including presentations, group discussions and group activities along with hands on experiences wherever it was needed. Detailed presentations followed by group discussions on NROER and its technical aspects, copyright issues, OERs licensing processes and different OER licenses, various models for e-content creation etc. were also done. Various activities like translation of concepts and resources in different State or regional languages, creation of e-content (audio-video recordings), evaluation of e-content, registration on NROER, contribution on NROER, registration for e-content evaluator, making of concept maps, mapping of resources with concepts and drafting a State plan of action for NROER activities etc. were carried out in different sessions of the programmes. Because of diversified language proficiencies of the participants, concepts' and resources' translation and creation could be done in 28 Indian languages. During these programmes thousands of resources including audio-video programmes, audio programmes, interactive objects and images were also recieved from more than twelve States for NROER.

These core groups will now become the teams of master trainers in their respective States/UTs. They will carry forward the activities on NROER through events and training programmes to encourage educational institutions, teachers and other e-content creators to share their content (in their own language/s), translation of concepts and resources in multiple languages ,engage in peer review and adapt as well as adopt resources to enrich this repository. The core groups will also collate the digital content from all the sources of State/UT along with ensuring the digitization of other available content for sharing on NROER.
